Did You Know Special Olympics Florida Was Born Locally?

Celebrating 50 Years, 1969-2019

Meet our Hometown Hero, local Special Olympics Florida founder Charlie Mc-Farland, who has something in common with Eunice Kennedy Shriver, iconic Special Olympics national founder. Like Eunice, Charlie believes in the spirit and souls of those who have special needs. Even though Charlie passed the baton to current Director Pamela Sparks, another Hometown Hero, for 40 years he committed himself to helping our local athletes pursue their

Charlie remembers when it all began: In 1968, 20 students from Silver Sands School in Fort Walton Beach attended a national special needs athletic competition established by the Kennedy Foundation. By May 1970, with still no organized sports for special needs athletes in our area, a state game was held in Ft. Walton Beach through the Foundation and



250 athletes from throughout Florida participated. Two months later a state team of 50 Florida athletes, along with 950 additional athletes from the U.S. and Canada, traveled to the first Special Olympics competition held at Chicago's Soldier Field, the national Special Olympics birthplace founded in 1968. Since then, Okaloosa County has sent delegates to USA, National and World Games. "At first," says Charlie, "all games were held at one time each year. But, later, due to the increase in the number of participants and the desire for the athletes to compete in different sports, Special Olympics became summer and winter, and then year-round." The first Florida Winter Games were hosted in Fort Walton Beach by Eglin Air Force Base.

"In 1985, there was an athlete that wanted to participate in winter games. So, we went to Boone, N.C., and he won a gold medal in Alpine Skiing! He had never skied before, yet won the gold!" chuckled Charlie. "In the early days, we had some celebrities, such the vocal band Alabama, Reba McEntire, Mickey Mantle and others who assisted me with funding to help Special Olympics get started here," says Charlie. "We also have the only non-military flag in the world that has flown into space aboard the space shuttle Discovery in

Pamela's initial participation with Special Olympics was as a "Fan in the Stands" as her son, Chase (now a 16-time medalist) and his teammates participated in Special Olympics basketball through Silver Sands School in 2005. As her passion for the athletes grew, Pamela felt led to leave her six-figure profession in 2016 and accept the offer as Okaloosa County Director to give the athletes a voice and grow the program. What's most important to her is the athletes' quality of life. "Sports is secondary," she says. "It's really all about their health and wellness. Special Olympics Florida is a community where everyone has the lifelong opportunity to develop physically, socially and emotionally through sports, wellness and leadership training."

Special Olympics Florida - Okaloosa County provides year-round sports training and competition to children and adults with and without intellectual disabilities, at no cost to the athlete nor the unified partner. "Locally we offer 18 different sports to athletes ages 8 and up helping to develop their fine and gross motor skills, showcase their talents and help achieve physical fitness—the best of all—athletes

never age out," says Pamela. Local athlete, Ann James, age 61, won her first Gold Medal in 1969 (age 11) in S.C. and 50 years later she just won another Gold Medal at State Swim this past October. "Special Olympics is their life! With multiple teams per sport, it's not one event, but sports, games and competitions that occur almost 365 days a year," Pamela says. "And research shows athletes achieve better academics, gain self-esteem and life skills necessary to be productive, respected and contributing members of our community with increased public awareness of their capabilities and needs." Currently 510 athletes in Okaloosa County compete in Basketball, Bocce, Bowling, Cheerleading, Cycling, Flag Football, Golf, Gymnastics, Pickleball, Powerlifting, Soccer, Softball, Stand Up Paddle, Surfing, Swimming, Tennis and Volleyball and soon to offer Equestrian. Each sports season lasts approximately three to four months with at least eight weeks



of training and three levels of competition: County, Area and State Games.

Statewide, the program serves over 54,000 athletes including Unified partner and Young Athletes and Okaloosa County is a great contributor to that growth. Included in our local area are students, unified partners and athletes from several local area middle schools and high schools. The Stem Academy offers Pre-KD for the Young athlete program (YAP) ages 2-7.

In summer of 2022, Disney World will officially host the 2022 Special Olympics USA Games at the ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex Summer of 2022. "This event will mark the largest humanitarian event in Florida's history!" says Pamela. "Additionally, we will celebrate the 50th anniversary of Special Olympics Florida!"

Special Olympics never charges for participation regardless of demographics or economics. "We provide everything from water, uniforms,

equipment, transportation, food and lodging," says Pamela. "Locally we're not government funded; we depend on individual and corporate contributions and fundraising; so, every dollar matters and volunteers are vital as we have no paid staff." "Fifty years ago, few knew the potential hiding within people with intellectual disabilities," says Pamela. "Today, our community can witness our athletes thriving, not only on the playing field, but also throughout the community. R.I.S.E. Helping the Community Rise Up Together

In Fort Walton Beach there is a movement to bridge the gap between job openings and skilled laborers. This community, which depends on construction and other skilled labor jobs, will lose a large part of its workforce as the baby boomers in these industries start to retire. At the same time, young adults in this area who have aged out of foster care or have spent time in the Department of Juvenile Justice, need jobs as they learn to transition into adulthood.

R.I.S.E., which stands for recruit, insight, support and educate, is a nonprofit organization in Fort Walton Beach, founded by Pastor Willie Farrow and Kevin Reeves, to support our atrisk youth and help prepare them to fill the skilled labor jobs that are becoming available in the community. "We see ourselves as being an entity to bring an awareness to the community, and how we can address this need within it," said Pastor Willie.

Governor Ron DeSantis has pushed for more certificate programs in Florida because people are needed in the trades. He has requested millions to help support workforce education and technical programs. Central Florida and South Florida have 21st Century Community Learning Centers, that not only help kids at low-performing schools, but also have career and adult education with certificate programs. There are no programs like that here.



"We find in this area, the panhandle of Florida, we do not have a transition home or transitional services for youth," stated Pastor Willie. "Why do we incarcerate the youth when we really need them to be a functional part of the tax base? The best thing for us to do then is to counsel and guide them through the process so they can become contributing members of our community."

R.I.S.E. wants to help as the need for plumbers, electricians, carpenters and HVAC technicians continues to grow. "We have vacancies in the construction and trade industries, as the average age of construction workers is 56-57 years old. If we don't start training the existing workforce, in 10 years we're going to be out of workers," said Pastor Willie. "We want to be the catalyst in the middle to draw everybody together."


Their partner, Beulah First Baptist Church, acquired Brooks Elementary recently. R.I.S.E. is working with businesses in the community to remodel it into a vocational school that will accommodate 200 students where they can get GED assistance, tutoring, and access to certificate programs.

In addition to the school, R.I.S.E. wants to build 48 transition homes. When children leave foster care at 18, they are on their own unless they have a transitional home. The Department of Juvenile Justice is looking to agencies, like R.I.S.E., who can provide these homes to keep young adults from entering or reentering the criminal justice system. "We know what we have to do is lay the groundwork because the funding and the opportunities are there to meet the greater need, which is our community and our children," said Pastor Willie. By providing homes and a workforce education, R.I.S.E. will be setting up our youth for success, which also makes our community sucRecently, Green Berets from Eglin, along with a group of kids from the Department of Juvenile Justice, volunteered to clean up Brooks Elementary. The event was sponsored by Okaloosa Gas, Gulf Power, Chelco and Vincent Jones Roofing. R.I.S.E. will continue to hold events as well as fundraisers to keep the project rolling; and in February, Beulah First Baptist Church will host the FAMU gospel choir to raise funds.

Pastor Willie said they are looking to build relationships with chapel services on military bases, as well as local colleges. They are also very grateful for community members who want to get involved. 



We hope the happiness flows for you during the holidays but we have to be just a touch "Grinchlike" and remind you that unfortunately this is also the season for burglaries, porch pirates, and other crimes of opportunity!

The Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office hopes a happy holiday season is in store for all our residents and that's why we want to share some tips to increase the odds in your favor!

One of our biggest crime issues countywide is car burglaries and the vast majority involve unlocked cars. With holiday shopping - and any time for that matter, it's imperative that you hide your valuables, lock your doors, and take your keys! You also want to be careful about getting overloaded with your purchases inside stores and setting down one of your bags for "just a moment." Distracted shoppers are a typical target of thieves. Another important tip is when at the grocery store running down those turkeys or cans of pumpkin, make sure your purse or wallet is safely secured and kept close at all times. These small steps can go a long way to keep criminals from taking possession of your cash or purchases. In fact, we recommend you not carry large amounts of cash or fistfuls of credit cards.

Another crime that takes off each holiday season is the proliferation of porch pirates – the thieves who sneak around and



steal delivered packages off your doorstep. Many of our residents have been investing in surveillance video systems which is a solid potential deterrent.

Here are some Porch Pirate prevention tips from Forbes magazine to ponder:

- Ship to an Amazon Locker or FedEx Office.
- Send the packages to your work address or a friend you know will be home.
- Install an outdoor security camera. Many systems will send real-time alerts to your smart-

phone when the motion detector senses movement.

- Keep your property well lit. Sometimes those porch pirates will wait until dark before they do the evil deeds. Keep your sidewalk and porch nice and bright.
- Make it look like you are home. This is good common sense, regardless of whether or not you're expecting a package. Lights going on and off inside a home will help keep burglars from not only stealing what's sitting on your porch, but also from breaking into your home.

Overall, staying vigilant and not getting rattled and rushed are key components to keeping safety a top priority during the hectic holidays. Slow down and take time to think about shopping safety both in stores and online, to take the steps necessary to try to avoid being an easy target for burglars or thieves, and also to avoid the stresses of the often excessive demands of the season.

Holiday Energy Saving Tips

May this holiday season fill your home with joy, your heart with love, and your life with laughter. We will speak or receive similar sentiments this month. But for many, the holidays bring stress and not good tidings: finding the perfect gifts and wrapping them, baking the traditional cookies, decorating, and going to all of the office parties. When cooking the holiday feast, don't forget about the smaller appliances. Crockpots and microwaves use less energy and give off less heat than ovens and stoves. Also consider co-cooking: If one dish needs to bake at 400° and the other at 350°, considering sharing the baking time and set your oven at 375° and bake both.

Electronics are always a popular gift, but you can save energy. When choosing electronics — TVs, computers, gaming consoles, etc. — always look for Energy Star qualified electronics. These qualified electronics use less energy and save energy. Rechargeable batteries and LED lighting may not be on top of

anyone's list but they make great stocking stuffers and save energy. Also consider using smart power strips and turn off the electronics completely. Many electron-

ics, even when powered off, still use energy, I call them energy vampires.

It would be best to call them a cab. As a matter of fact, because you're furnishing the alcohol, I recommend a Special Events policy; they're affordable and provide excellent liability coverage."

"I once had a customer whose best friend almost burned down their house when she set a paper plate of left-overs on a still-hot burner. I'm glad we recently reviewed your policies. I'm comfortable knowing we should have plenty to rebuild your beautiful home if something were to happen."

Charter Approved for First Ever Destin High School

"Over the past few months, there's been quite a buzz over a new Destin High School; things continue to progress toward its opening," says Prebble Ramswell, Destin High School Inc. President.

In October, the Okaloosa County School District voted 5-0 to approve the charter school contract for the first high school in Destin's history and officially the newest school in Okaloosa County. It was also the final step in making Destin High School an official member of the OCSD. The OCSD board reviewed and praised the comprehensive preparation and planning of the 450-page contract to make sure it met Florida's standard for charter schools. And with that, classes are scheduled to begin for grades 9-10 in August 2020.

In July, Destin High School Inc. began the process of negotiating the purchase of Destin United Methodist Church (200 Beach Drive) to be its campus a \$12.9 million, 8.34-acre property. And Tallahassee-based consulting firm Collaborative Educational Network has begun its search for Destin High School's first principal. The school plans to expand after the first year to include grades 9-11 in 2021-2022 and grades 9-12 in 2022-2023. A mascot, logo and school colors will be announced

"But now begins the real work," says Prebble. "We will be conducting major fundraising, recruiting, retrofitting and

Prebble says the biggest initial task is fundraising. "Since the school district is not paying for this school, the community



Boats light up the night on the Harbor where the brightest, most creative ones win the holiday and a few lucky seafar-



dress in theme costumes and entertain using all things that assault the senses from a visual and sound standpoint. "It's just as much about the boat community as watchers and bystanders









"It's a good excuse, says Mary Ann Windes, Destin Fishing Fleet, Party Boat Destin Princess and Party Boat Destiny, "to go boating in the winter and celebrate the holidays. During the parade, you'll be sure to see elaborate light displays," she says. "Some lights are choreographed to Christmas music and other boats sport famous passengers like Santa and the Grinch. 

Can't make it to a gym? Your home or park will do. Get your family to join. A family that plays together, stays together! Make it fun, even a good brisk low impact walk will raise metabolism as well as endorphins to make you feel good, and should I say JUSTIFY a little overeating when tempted.

Don't have a workout program? Try this holiday fat burning, muscle building treat—a gift from me

Exercises are arranged in blocks. Each block should be completed twice before moving on to the next. Do 15 repetitions per exercise.

*Warm up with a 5 minute walk.

- Stationary Lunges (split lunges)
- Plank with alternating row (in plank, pull one arm back like you are pulling a lawn mower cord from the floor then alternate to other side)

Inhibit The Holiday Halo • Push-up to Downward Dog (alternate from single pushup to

piking your hips up making a teepee shape with your body then back to pushup)

• Side Elbow Plank

- Wide Squats see if you can reach the floor with back straight & chest and head up (you can bend over from hips only and as little as possible. heels planted knees direction of toes)
- Grocery Biceps (fill a grocery bag to desired weight with cans or rocks, or whatever)

- Tricep Dips
- Grocery Shoulders (fill grocery bags and press overhead or straight out to sides)

Block 3

- Bridge Dips (on back, feet on floor, knees bent, push hips up toward ceiling then back to floor)
- Seated Side Twists (Russian Twists) lean back to engage abs
- Anchored Leg Lifts or Knee Arcs (on floor, stabilize by grabbing something overhead with hands and raise and lower either straight legs or bent legs)

NOTE: To raise intensity, add

jumping jacks, jumping rope, running in place or any cardio movement of choice for 1-3 minutes in-between each block. I suggest this only if you have already been doing this form of exercise and you have no underlying reasons not to. Remember Be Active, Stay Active

FUN HOLIDAY FACT: The average person can burn an estimated 75-100 calories per 30 minutes of SHOPPING! Add a shopping cart and move more briskly and that number can be higher!! Go get 'em!

De-Stressing Your Holidays

There I sat crying in a butter-soaked shirt, holding a tired, screaming baby wondering why I ever agreed to three Christmases in one day. It was our baby son's first Christmas, and was supposed to be a picturesque, magical day to remember. We decorated, dressed our son in his Christmas sweater, baked requested casseroles, packed thoughtful gifts, wore new clothes, and went to three family gatherings that ended in tears and feelings of overwhelm. Is this really what Christmas is supposed to be? Stressful, exhausting, overwhelming, and disappointing? Or is there another way?

Historically, Christmas and the preceding weeks were about expectations surrounding the birth of Jesus. Currently, you might find yourself juggling spiritual and cultural expectations around Christmas and other winter holidays including decorating stylishly, hosting gatherings, reflecting spiritually, going to church events, gift-giving, participating in family traditions, spending meaningful time with extended family, etc. With good intentions, you may place impossible expectations on these few weeks of the year to bring fulfillment and happy memories. Afterwards though, you could be left with the disappointing reality of hurt feelings, burnt ham, criticism from family, underwhelming responses to gifts, and kids preferring to text friends instead of playing family board games.

So, what can be done?



Five ways to De-Stress the Holidays:

• Sort your expectations into two categories: healthy and unhealthy. Healthy expectations are reasonable, gracious, encourage growth, and don't result in shame. Unhealthy expectations are idealistic, unreasonable, perfectionistic, involve trying to control others, and result in feeling ashamed. Reducing stress begins with getting curious about what you are expecting of yourself and others. Are you trying to present a perfect image of yourself? Are you trying to get someone else to be who you want them to be? Are you trying to get an emotional need met from someone who is not likely to meet that need?

- Consider what will happen if you let your unhealthy expectations go. Most often you hold unhealthy expectations because you fear loss of control, when in reality, you didn't really have control in the first place. Admitting that you only have control of yourself can set you free and empower you to manage yourself in healthier ways.
- Identify unhealthy expectations that others may have invited you to fulfill. Maybe you're still seeking approval from your parents, or hustling to live up to social expectations of friends, or exhausting yourself trying to keep your kids happy. If you find yourself resenting someone, it's often a sign that unrealistic expectations are present in the relationship.
 - Set boundaries with your-

self and others. Adjust unhealthy personal expectations and allow time to realize your worst fears will not be realized as a result. Try giving yourself permission to say no to unhealthy requests of others even if someone will be disappointed. They will survive the disappointment and so will you. Boundaries are usually uncomfortable initially and then all involved get used to them over time. In the long-term, such boundaries create oxygen for life.

• Decide how you will fill the space that results from letting go of unhealthy expectations. When you think about what feels healthy and meaningful around the holidays, do that and enjoy it deeply.

For us, letting go of unhealthy expectations has set us free from exhausting, expensive, perfection-oriented busyness and has created space for intentional, reflective, restful, family time on Christmas Day. The difference is astounding. What will you do to create and enjoy healthier space this holiday season?

One day, I hope I can be.




The lights quickly came back on and the parishioners went home that night, glad to be alive. One look from my wife silently said, "You silly, silly man."

As investors look toward 2020 and back on recent history, there are a lot of things on their minds. They have a lot on their minds because the market, at least in the last two years, has had some significant moves. Last year the market ended up with dramatic selloffs around Christmas making December 2018 one of the worst months for performance in the history that records were kept. And this year, investors (growth or equity-oriented investors) have seen returns that have far surpassed historical numbers. More conservative or income-oriented investors have seen the interest on their bonds and or sayings decline as interest rates have reversed themselves over the past year.

So, looking into the end of the year and in to next and beyond, what are things that investors might want to be considering? We can start at a macro level with interest rates. World monetary policy and domestically, the Federal Reserve policy has been what is called quite dovish as world banks and the Fed have insured there is a significant supply of money in the system. This was done because of concerns over an economic slowdown (take Germany as an example). Some rates around the world have now turned negative where the investor gets back less than what was invested but do get the return of the face amount of what they bought. The result has been the return to lower rates of return for safe and for conservative investments. The implication is that those investors might take on more risk by considering investments (high yielding dividend stocks as an example). Thing to consider: Is that driving up stock prices?

Secondly, trade as a consideration. Here in the U.S., industry leaders are planning with less certainty than they have had in the past because the outcomes of trade negotiations are not fully known yet. Are current tariffs hurting trade, cost, industry, profitability? There is nothing conclusive at this point. So, while lower interest rates might be fueling higher asset (read that stock) prices, does trade uncertainty make the stock market more volatile as result. So, second thing to

consider: Will trade uncertainty lead to more short-term volatility.

Lastly, the strength of the economy. While corporate profits have held up, employment is at all time lows and inflation remains low, what about the long-term health of the economy? Investors are left wondering as economic growth is currently about 2.2% and for an economy to sustain growth, most would agree that 3% is a more acceptable or needed growth rate. What about the state of U.S. manufacturing? Currently it is not seen as robust and many think that important to sustain asset prices (stock prices). So, third thing to consider: What is the long-term strength of the U.S. and world economy.

Historically, stocks have outperformed bonds as well as cash instruments for over 90 years. According to Ibbotson and Associate through 2018, stocks have returned 10%, government bonds returning 5.5% and Treasury bills (closely related to cash) 3.47%. Inflation by contrast has average 2.9% in that time frame.

In the short run, stocks have proven more volatile. In the past year alone the S&P 500 has averaged 13.7% but over the last two years, 9.3%. Investors can look back further and see that for five years it is 8.7% and for 10 years 11%. You can keep going and see that at 15 years it is 6.7% (accounts for a lot of volatility in 2008) and 20 years 8%.

That might have investors wondering when to "get in" and when to "get out." There is no strategy or formula for this. Investor may want to recall that familiar saying: They don't ring a bell at the top and they don't ring a bell at the bottom. Unless the need for cash or income is now, staying the course,if an investor has a long term time frame (meaning at least 10 years), stocks might offer the best option.

Boxing, the Machine and Cheese Steaks, Part III

Have you ever taken anything apart to see how it works? I have – and sometimes I ended up with extra pieces when I put it back together. I remember when that happened with a watch when I was younger. I took the back off, looked at the guts – took them apart one by one to see how they were connected, and then put it all back

together again. When I looked at the watch ticking away, I was very proud - not bad for an eight-year old! But then I noticed something - I realized there was a piece that didn't make it back into the watch, but the watch was still working. Puzzled, I took the watch apart again and for the life of me couldn't remember where the piece went. The weird thing was, the watch still worked after putting it back together - missing piece and all! Still not satisfied that I put it back together the right way, I took it apart again and still couldn't figure out what happened. Finally - frustrated, I guessed I knew more than the watch manufacturer, eliminated this extremely unneeded piece and put the watch back together again. Voila! The watch worked

– genius!! But no matter what, I enjoyed the process, it taught me to pay attention.

Remember the movie Rocky? He needed to go the distance — so he sought help from Mickey — an old timer with lots of boxing knowledge. And with that transference of knowledge, came the inner skill to last 12 rounds. Ever watch a cooking show such as Top Chef? When it comes to making great food in a hurry and good enough to stand the test of food critics, there has to be a process, or the food won't be done on time and they'll lose the opportunity to become Top Chef!

And processes are important – especially when it comes to insurance – and especially when it comes to filing insurance claims. If you want to have a success-

to specific forms, and depending on the state, time tables set up that require insurance company adjusters to acknowledge, inspect and answer the insured when they file claims and have questions. TIME is key to understanding how you, and The Machine are held accountable for good faith claims practices. Time is the foundation of claims. And unlike like a watch that can be taken apart again and again, a claim doesn't have that type of grace. Once things are compromised it's very difficult to put it back together again for the insured and insurer.




"Yes I was, which was a tre-


