Hometown Heroes: **Meet Local Veteran Business Owners**

"Eat fresh." "Choose well." Welcome to Destin's three Subways, located in Miramar Beach, the Best Buy shopping plaza and Walmart. All are owned by local Army Ranger Veteran Josh Gregory who served six years in the 3rd Ranger Battalion, and originally is from Columbus, Ga. Josh, his wife Cameron, and son Carson moved to Destin in March of last year. Why did this former Culinary School graduate, Marriott Executive Banquet Chef and owner of CJ's Steakhouse decide to own Subways? As Josh explains, he was looking for something more family-oriented that provided him flexibility, so he could spend more time with his family. "I can now attend Carson's baseball and soccer games and be present." And that he does, even going as far to sponsor every single age group of each sport for Destin's own Community Center. That's a lot of Subway jerseys - more than 300 to be exact! He also sponsors Des-

An Army veteran with more than 30 years of service to his country, a local community man who's lived here since 1995 (pre-Walmart!), and the proud owner of Destin's own Ben & Jerry's: meet Gregory Valloch. He lives by the creed from his high school, which states: "I believe the cardinal virtues of an individual are courage, honesty, temperance and wisdom. Originally from Vermont, the birthplace of the original Ben & Jerry's housed in an old converted gas station in Burlington, Gregory Valloch knew they had a fine product

Independence Day is our country commemorating the Declaration of Independence of the United States when on July 4, 1776, Americans declared that we were no longer subject to the monarch of Britain and declared ourselves united, free and independent states.

There is much to celebrate on "Independence Day," especially in our part of the world where patriotism runs deep and so many of our neighbors are active duty or retired military veterans who've served the USA with pride and distinction. Yet keep in mind, while many of us are enjoying 4th of July holiday festivities, first responders, like deputies with the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office, are responding to an endless stream of calls - contending with everything from disturbances and fireworks complaints to reckless vehicles and traffic crashes.

Summer, in general, is the season most associated with the use of fireworks, and it is important to use caution and to remember they can be dangerous when used improperly. To ensure our residents and visitors stay safe this season, you're encouraged to keep the following tips in mind:

Use only approved products. Many dangerous and illegal fireworks, rockets and explosive devices are readily available for purchase. By Florida law, these are unlawful for private fireworks displays and are significantly more likely to cause fires.

• Do not sign a waiver in order to purchase illegal fire-

works. Signing a waiver will not clear a consumer of responsibility if caught illegally using fireworks.

• Only purchase sparklers from licensed vendors.

Control your environment. Sparklers should be used only on sand, concrete or another non-flammable surface, away from brush, trash or other objects that could catch fire.

• Never give sparklers to young children, as they can reach temperatures between 1,300 and 1,800 degrees, which is at least 200 degrees hotter than a standard butane lighter.

• Keep pets indoors and away from all sparklers.

• Light only one item at a time and never attempt to relight.

Be prepared. Have a fire extinguisher or a hose and a bucket of water readily available.

Attend a public fireworks show. Be safe, not sorry. The best way to protect your loved ones this year is to attend one of the many public displays sponsored by communities or organizations all across our area and the state.

We all know that the holiday also can mean an increased risk of crashes and crash-related in-



juries or fatalities on both our roadways and waterways. Many of those crashes are alcohol-related and easily prevented. Deputies from the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office will be patrolling to locate and arrest impaired drivers and boaters, and remove them from our streets and waters. Arrests for DUI and BUI (boating under the influence) will be made with zero tolerance.

Traffic congestion can mean impatient drivers, not just during the holiday but all summer long. Some of the common causes of local crashes are: Speeding, following too closely, running red lights, making unsafe lane changes, careless driving, aggressive driving, and driving under the influence. Please be patient with the influx of heavy traffic! There really is nowhere to go to escape it.

We ask that drivers obey the speed limit, drive with patience and tolerance for other drivers, don't text and drive, drive defensively, wear your safety belt, and make sure children are using appropriate child restraints.



We also ask anyone who plans to drink and party to use a taxi, Uber, or designated driver to get home. Remember, **"When** you plan for the party, plan your safe ride home first!"

The Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office needs you to partner with our deputies to help keep our roadways and waterways safe. You can report unsafe or impaired drivers by calling the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office at 651-7400 or 689-5705 or 9-1-1.

Emerald Coast Autism Center Celebrates 10 Years!

What happens when a mom of a five year old with autism and a Special Education Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) therapist put their heads together?

They create a local, non-profit school and therapy center for autistic kids, the Emerald Coast Autism Center, (ECAC) right here in Niceville.

When asked why they developed and opened the center, Heidi Blalock says, "There were not enough quality services available for my child back in 2009, no full-time solution to help us." She goes on to say, "The longest increments of therapy lasted about two hours, and we saw such a difference, that we thought all day therapy might work better."

What started off in a church, then moved to a strip mall, finally after a capital campaign to raise funds, ECAC became a



beneficiary of the Destin Charity Wine Auction Foundation. Heidi and Staci Berryman were able to open their own facility on the Northwest Florida State College campus, 2¹/₂ years ago.

Fast-forward 10 years; ECAC has helped a tremendous number of children and their families. They not only treat the child with autism, but treat the family as well. They must be doing something right, for families who have children with autism are moving to Niceville to get help, especially military families.

Applied Behavior Analysis is the only proven intervention for children with autism, which is a wide-spectrum disorder (meaning that no autistic child is the same). ECAC's goal is to provide intensive therapy to kids as young as possible to provide tools to integrate them back into school, while also working with their families. ABA ensures that every child works one-on-one with his own therapist on a daily basis. They treat children ages 2-19, and no day is typical. Therapy is individualized for that specific child, working on language, behavioral, and social issues. Heidi says, "Consistency is key here, and we work with the parents closely to make sure everyone is following the same protocols." Currently, ECAC is working with 90 families in the local area, and employs more than 70 therapists.

ABA is medically based, and insurance often covers it. In the state of Florida, many families can also apply for a voucher program through the Department of Education called the McKay Scholarship. fantastic organization that has helped so many kids and their families in our area? Come check out the Summer Jam 2019 on July 13th at the Emerald Coast Convention Center. Edwin Watts, a member of the Mulligans along with the other band members are hosting the event and will be playing live music. 100% of the proceeds raised will benefit ECAC. Short Term Rental Checklist

"Good morning, this is Jenny, how may I help you?" Jenny enjoyed her job at a local vacation rental management company. It was a booming business, keeping her quite busy. For Jenny, she loved getting to know her property owners who were wonderful people.

Jack, a new customer, had one of those deep, calm voices over the phone, with a hint of the south in his lengthened vowels. He was finalizing a purchase in one of her favorite communities and asked for some direction regarding insurance. Jenny gave him several options.

A few weeks after the purchase, he stopped by her office to introduce himself, and they struck up a conversation. "First of all, Jenny, I want to thank you for your help," he smiled. "I learned a lot about insurance in Florida I never knew before."

"I'm glad I could be of assistance."

"Did you know that it makes a difference on how few nights you rent out your place?" Jack went on to explain in detail all the interesting insurance tidbits he'd discovered during his quest for coverage.

You might be under the impression that homeowners insurance and landlord/tenant (rental property) insurance are the same. They do have commonalities, of course. The homeowner form is usually broader and is used if the occupancy is primary or a secondary residence. The dwelling fire form is more limited and is usually required when the home has rental exposure. Regardless of the form, you want the right amount of coverage to rebuild the primary dwelling and other structures on the property, along with hurricane and wind protection. Insurance industry statistics show that 2 out of 3 homes are underinsured. Other essential areas of coverage include replacement cost on the contents, loss of rent, loss assessments, liability, and rebuild to code (Ordinance or Law), increased mold and much more.

You might also think there's no difference in coverage or carriers depending on whether you rent your place out annually, for a week, or for a few nights. But there you'd be wrong.

"What will be the shortest length of time you'll offer your place for rent?" The answer to this question is crucial in making sure you have the right policy. Some carriers allow only annual leases, some a minimum of one-week rental, and a few others allow less than seven nights. You might be wondering why it's all that important. In the world of insurance, all information should be as accurate as possible, so a carrier won't have a ready excuse to deny a claim.

For short term rentals, since they come fully furnished, make sure you have enough contents coverage to replace the furniture, dishes, linens, accessories, decorations, etc. in the event of a loss. Replacement cost is always recommended over actual cash value, since actual cash value depreciates the items for age and wear and tear.

There's also the added liability exposure with rentals. If your weekend getaway renter trips over a rug, falls down the stairs, and breaks his leg, you need to be ready for a possible lawsuit. Most rental property policies offer liability coverage options between \$300,000 and \$500,000. Depending on the amount of assets you need to protect, it might be beneficial to purchase a separate excess liability policy with coverage limits starting at \$1 million or more for your rental property. If the property is titled to you individually and you have a personal Umbrella policy in place, you may be able to add your rental property to that policy. One caveat - if your rental property is titled in an LLC, partnership or other entity instead of your personal name, you probably won't be able to add it to your personal Umbrella. Excess liability policies are an affordable way to obtain extra asset protection.

Many resort communities allow the use of golf carts within their boundaries, and if you own a golf cart for use by your renters, you'll need to have the correct type of golf cart insurance. A golf cart policy written for your own personal use is not the same type of policy and any use by a renter would be excluded. You would need to purchase a commercial liability policy designed to cover the rental exposure and use by your renters.

And, of course, you don't want to forget about flood insurance. It's as important to have a flood policy on your primary residence as it is on your rental properties, and one should consider purchasing limits to the full replacement cost of the dwelling and contents.

When it comes to short term rental insurance, always speak with an insurance professional, and make sure you have the coverage you need to make your rental experience a successful one.

Q. My prescription drug plan has a premium of \$24.10 per month. However, I'm being charged more! My carrier says it is a late enrollment penalty. How can they get away with this? - John

A. This is a common cause of confusion. The penalty that you are being charged is actually being imposed on you by Medicare. Insurance carrier plans have set premiums. In general, everyone that applies for that prescription plan pays the same amount.

However, Medicare has a rule that states if you are eligible for a Medicare prescription drug plan and elect to not be covered, then you are assessed a penalty. Medicare calculates the penalty by charging 1% of the "national base beneficiary premium" (\$33.19 in 2019) for every month that you were eligible for coverage and chose not to participate. There are exceptions to this rule for those who have what Medicare deems "creditable coverage." John, unfortunately, in most cases, this penalty is permanent and will be charged regardless of which carrier you choose. It is simply added to the prescription drug premium that a carrier charges for their plan. Again, the penalty is assessed by Medicare, so the carrier has no choice but to collect it.

We recommend that you sit down with an independent insurance advisor each fall and review your coverage. Five Things to Watch During Hurricane Season

One: The Date

The official start of hurricane season is June 1 and lasts through November 30. But for the fifth year in a row, the season started

early, with sub-tropical storm Andrea forming in the gulf in late May. September is historically the most active month by far but August and October bring their fair share of backbreakers. It seems wrong to have the Disaster Spending Bill for the 2018 season sitting on the President's desk when the 2019 season has already started. It reminds me of those NFL players that hold off on signing their contracts until the first game has already been played, looking for leverage. In this case, though, Mother Earth is a tough negotiator.

Two: The Season Forecast

Every year the National Oce-

anic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) analyzes climate data and comes up with a prediction for the coming season. The headlines you might see from this year include "NOAA predicts a near-normal hurricane season," but that is a little misleading. They only gave it a 40% chance of being near-normal, meaning it is more likely not to be normal, for better or worse. An average season still means six hurricanes; it only takes one to ruin your day. NOAA predictions tend to be reliable. In 2005, for example, the busiest season on record with 15 hurricanes, NOAA gave it a 70% chance of being an abovenormal season with a prediction

of 7-9 hurricanes. In that year, six storms each caused more than \$1 billion in damage. In 2015 for another example, they gave it a 70% chance of being belownormal season. In that year there were only four hurricanes and less than \$1 billion total damage for the entire season.

Three: Improvements

This year, three new NOAA satellites will see action and NOAA has upgraded its model for the first time in 40 years. It is a complicated model that takes into account sea temperatures, El Nino, and West African monsoons among countless other factors. So, it comes as no surprise that they were cautious in replac-

ing it. We all hope this investment in technology will allow earlier warnings and more accurate instorm data. We learn from each storm and build stronger next time. If hurricanes haven't evicted our love affair with the beach by now, they never will.

Four: The Storm Headed Your Way

The 2018 prediction was very similar to 2019's and it was anything but a normal season to us and our friends in Panama City. Last year, there ended up being eight hurricanes and two at Category 3 or higher, both inside the range provided in the model and considered "normal." So, don't take the soft forecast for granted. Michael and Florence, the only two major storms of the 2018 season, accounted for nearly \$50 billion in damage, or 98% of the total damage done during the season. The worst storm in history is the one that hits you.

Five: Your Supplies and Plans

It is wise to be prepared well in advance. An average hurricane season is like an average broken leg, there are a lot of ways to break a leg and all of them suck. Make sure you have supplies of food and water for several days, a travel plan, double check your insurance policies, and maybe ask your insurance agent for some time to go over everything. An insurance agent should do more than sell you insurance; they should be available to answer questions and offer feedback. Off the Hook Cali's July Fishing Report

Last month we talked about the hype of Red Snapper season in Destin, the fight they put up and what a tasty dinner they make. While they are a highlight for most anglers each summer, a lot of other great species are biting this time of year for those who have had their fill of Snapper.

For starters, schools of Tarpon have finally arrived on our Emerald Coast and that excites even the most novice anglers. Tarpon, also known as the Silver King, is one of the most sought-after fish to be caught. You might have to hunt for them, but they can be found in schools, swimming nearshore, looking for food. These beautiful creatures have been around for hundreds of years and are one of the toughest fish to get to the boat. Watch them spin and roll on the surface of the water, and once hooked they will fight and jump in the air, trying



to loosen the hook. A full Tarpon fight can last hours – even with no guarantee they'll get to the boat. These fish can fight longer than most, because they breathe air like us. So, with every jump in the air, they take a gulp of fresh air and get another boost of energy. Because Tarpon are a protected species, even if you do get one to the boat, you cannot remove it from water. Pulling them up the side of the boat by their mouth for a quick photo is the closest you'll get to holding one here in Florida, and even then, at least 40 inches must remain in the water while doing so. We see them in Destin from early June to early August typically, as they migrate through to South Florida. "One of the reasons why the tarpon fishing is so good along Florida's northwest coast is that the fish are in full-on pre-spawn feeding mode. They're hungry, and very likely to attack a well-presented fly, lure or live bait." via VisitFlorida.com.

Other fish we're seeing more of are King Mackerel and Grouper, both of which can be caught offshore in our Gulf while fishing for Snapper. Both Red and Gag Grouper will bite while bottom fishing near a structure, but King Mackerel prefer a trolling bait to latch on to. Both are open season right now and are some of the top eating fish you'll catch.

As far as inshore fishing in Destin, redfish and trout are two sought after fish in our Bay this time of year. Finding those slot sized redfish means seeking them out in places they'll be nestled in, eating. The slot sized fish typically prefer Oyster beds, bridge piling and docks, and it's a bonus if you can find them in depths of 5 ft., with a shallow patch nearby. You can catch redfish on crustaceans, using shrimp or crabs or even pinfish or croaker. They will even bite the right artificial bait when thrown at them.

Guide to Deep Sea Fishing

Although I'm in real estate, many people know my family's affiliation with the Destin Fishing Fleet. So, I get asked often many, many, many fishing questions. The most confusing part about coming to fish in the World's Luckiest Fishing Village is knowing who to call, and much like real estate, even I can't answer that one until I ask some probing questions first to figure out your goals.

Deep sea fishing is different from fishing in the Bay, going to Crab Island, or renting a pontoon or jet ski. Those are fun activities. However, they don't allow you to bring back hundreds of dollars' worth of fish. There are three distinct types of deep-sea fishing: charter boat, party boat, or a hybrid of the two with a grouped trip through a charter service. At the Destin Fishing Fleet Marina, we offer all three.

A private charter is the best, but also the most expensive. Most boats charge a base price like \$200 per hour for the first six passengers. Trips can range from





four hours to 36 hours depending on your skill level and courage. Some charter boats carry only six passengers. We call them six-packs. Larger boats that meet more stringent U.S. Coast Guard regulations are licensed to carry more than six. They often charge an additional fee, like 10% of the base price per passenger, for more than six passengers. The only people on a private charter, other than your group, is a captain and a mate (or two).

A party boat is a boat that charges a "per person" fee to go fishing. They often carry 35 or more passengers at a time, many of whom don't know another soul on the boat. The party boats are less expensive than a charter boat and highly recommended for people who have never fished before, although they also have customers who are avid fishermen who go almost every day. You just have to be okay fishing alongside people from all over the country who might or might not know what they're doing, which can lead to tangles and such. Listening to the crew will help with all that.

The third type of trip is a grouped charter. If you only have one to four people but want to fish with a smaller group, you can ask the charter service to set up a group (usually only up to eight people). They then charter the boat for you. The price is a little higher than a party boat, but you can split the cost of the charter boat. By the way, you can also charter a boat through Destin Charter Service (850) 837-1995, and since they know which boats are open, they can save you literally a hundred calls to find an open boat during the season.

Most of these boats have airconditioned cabins, bathrooms, bunks, and tables. The boats generally provide the bait, ice, tackle and fishing licenses, and you bring whatever you want to eat or drink in a cooler. The empty cooler can then be later used at the end of the day to take home your fish.

Screen Time Guidelines for Families

There is no way around it screens are here to stay. Technology will only continue to evolve as parents desperately try to keep up with it all. Many parents wonder, "How much is too much screen time?" "Should my toddler have a tablet?" Or lately, "Is my teenager addicted to video games?" There are more and more studies coming out to aide parents in determining what is age appropriate for children regarding media use.

Let's start with babies under the age of 18 months. According to the American Academy of Pediatrics, it is recommended that screen media be avoided at this developmental stage. At this age, a baby learns everything through communicating and interacting with those around him. If the parent or baby are watching TV or are on a smartphone, the complex communication where the child learns and develops, comes to a halt. Furthermore, a baby under 18 months has no ability to transfer what he is seeing on the screen to his world around him. Although he may track the screen and follow the bright colors, it is merely a distraction from the necessary learning that would occur if the baby interacted with the world around him.

Ages two to five years old can benefit from TV shows, but the quality of the programming is imperative. Educational/interactive shows such as Sesame Street and Dora the Explorer have some educational benefits. It is recommended that parents watch shows with their children to maximize the learning potential of these programs. The recommended amount of watching is limited to one hour per day. Excessive amounts of screen time have been linked to speech delays, poorer performance on developmental screenings, inability to pay attention and lack of social skills. It might be helpful at this age to consider screen time in the same way you consider junk food in your home. A treat once in awhile will cause limited harm, but too often can get in the way of healthy habits and long-term health.

For ages six through adult, it is highly recommended to develop an individual media plan for each member of the family. I often tell the parents in my office to use common sense when it comes to what technology rules to implement in their home. Each family has its own unique set of values and morals and, therefore, the screen time needs and abilities will also be unique to that family. As always, I encourage the caregivers of the family to come together and agree on all screen time policies and then present these agreed upon rules to the children as a united front. I also can't stress enough that children will follow their parents' lead. It is so important to model healthy screen time limits for children.

Many parents tell me that their children appear "addicted" to their phones and video games. In 2018 the World Health Organization (WHO) included "Gaming Disorder" to its 11th revision of the International Classification of Disease (ICD-11). When parents express concern over their children's habits, they have reason to be concerned. Children, including teenagers, lack the self-control to individually limit their own screen time. It is up to parents to set and model the family guidelines. If left to their own devices (pun intended), many children will lose valuable hours of sleep, face to face interactions with family and peers and physical movement to screen time. If gaming begins to take precedence over all other activities in a child's life or if there is impairment in the areas of social, educational and/or occupational functioning, a child might be diagnosed with a gaming disorder.

Some common tips that appear to limit the negative effects of screen time include following the American Academy of Pediatrics guidelines, having "screenfree" times throughout the day (dinner time, car rides, etc.), creating a "docking station" for all smart phones after a certain hour, limiting and monitoring social media use, putting computers and gaming systems in a family space in the home rather than children's bedrooms and routinely discussing online safety and responsibility with kids. The American Academy of Pediatrics also offers an online Family Media Plan tool kit to assist parents in developing individual media plans for family members. You can find that tool kit at www.HealthyChildren.org/ MediaUsePlan. Keeping up with technology can be overwhelming for parents, but there are many resources out there to help navigate this technological world. Screen time can be enjoyable as a form of entertainment and a way to connect with others, but as with all things enjoyable, moderation is the key to success.

What's Good for the Goose, is Good for the Gander In Respect of Independence Day...

Physical Fitness Training and Testing (PT or PFT) for all branches of the military, firefighters, and first responders is mandatory and essential to doing their jobs efficiently and safely. Anyone putting themselves in

harm's way better sure try and exceed the minimum requirements asked of them. They are tested for accountability by a periodic physical fitness test, and although there are movements that are common across the various branches, several add or tweak their tests to better fit their needs. So could this be good for all of us civilians?

It's the concept of "train for whatever your life demands." So, yes, it's all good for anyone, but we have to be smart about it. The military isn't haphazardly throwing out movements and training regulations that wouldn't pertain to their goals for being the best for the purpose of their division / branch. It's an excellent facet to take information, suggestions, research and ideas from and incorporate the functional movements of stability, strength, balance, agility, and core work from the ole tried and true; the ones that test and do this all the time. I admire and envy the dedication and motivation it takes to uphold the requirements asked of the military, first responders and firefighters. The real dedication is they know these requirements BEFORE they make the choice to enlist or join. In the average real world, it's hard enough for some people to just THINK about exercise; but I would be surprised if there is anyone out there that would say they don't want to be physically fit. Maybe seeing things in this perspective and learning how to set simple short and long term goals will help some get started, or, hopefully, some of the fun ideas that stem from military training will boost what the physically fit are already doing! Check out the Physical Fitness Testing protocols below.

Army PFT minimum for **Basic Training/Bootcamp:** The three events are two minutes of push-ups, two minutes of situps, and a timed 2-mile run.

Navy PFT & SEALS: minimum- swim 500 yds in 12:30, 42 push-ups, 50 sit-ups, 6 pull-ups, 1.5 mile run in 11:00... competi-

tive- swim 500 yds in 10:30, 79 push-ups, 11 pull-ups, 1.5 mile run in 10:20... advanced- swim 500 yds in 8:00, 80-100+ pushups, 80-100+ sit-ups, 20+ pullups, 1.5 mile run in 9:00 or less.

Airforce PFT: One-minute push-ups, one minute sit-ups, timed 1.5 mile run. While at Basic Military Training you will perform physical conditioning 5 days/week with alternating days of muscular endurance and aerobic running.

Marines PFT: The Marine Corps considers physical fitness an indispensable aspect of leadership. The habits of selfdiscipline required to gain and maintain a high level of physical fitness are inherent to the USMC way of life - combat readiness. They have two main components: The PFT and Body Composition Program.

Coast Guard PFT: The best way to succeed in CGPFT is to start a swimming training program. Push-ups 60 secs, Situps 60 secs, Run 1.5 miles in 12:51, Sit and Reach flexibility



test, complete swim circuit test (tread water 5min.), and jump off 5-foot platform into a pool and swim 100 meters.

Men Need Estrogen? Of Course They Do!

Estrogen is vitally important in men! Last month (Visit MyDestinLife.com June 2019) I wrote about testosterone in women and just scratched the surface of benefits that women receive after optimizing their testosterone. This month, I want to turn the tables and talk about the importance of estrogen in Men.

In our bodies, Testosterone converts into Estrogen. That doesn't mean estrogen is a waste product. Optimal estrogen levels improve both emotional status and overall health. The conversion of testosterone into estrogen is how women get estrogen. Okay guys, we can all describe women who get emotional around "that time." One day they are mad and screaming at us for eating the last Dove Bar from the freezer and then two days later they are crying, because we forgot the anniversary of the first time you ate at Shakes together! (Not that this has ever happened to me.) This happens because estrogen falls too low and then shoots too high during "that time" of the month. After menopause, estrogen crashes to zero and women start having constant irritability, depression and anger. The same issues occur in men,

but since their Testosterone falls



slowly over the years, men don't notice the increasing irritability, depression and anger. Elevated estrogen levels tend to cause you to be tearful, sentimental and overly emotional. Low estrogen levels tend to cause irritability, anger, depression and self isolation. This is true in both men and women.

You see a crotchety old man or an old friend who never goes out anymore? I see a low estrogen level. Similar issues occur in men on testosterone shots. Shots increase testosterone too high and too fast. The body tries to get rid of this excess testosterone by converting it to estrogen. As estrogen climbs, guys start reading Hallmark cards and crying at puppy dogs. Many guys take an estrogen blocker and become irritable, depressed or angry as estrogen begins to fall. This low estrogen can increase strokes, heart attacks and cancer. That's why these huge, buff bodybuilders drop dead at age 40 from a heart attack or stroke. They increase their risk by blocking estrogen for years and years.

Many men we treat say, "I feel like I just walked out of a cloud I've been living in for 10 years." Those who were previously on testosterone shots and get treated by us all talk about the emotional roller coaster they had been on and how happy they are to finally have consistent good days.

There are two major issues with estrogen in men. First, doctors rarely or never check an estrogen level in men. It is the first hormone I look at! Second, many doctors give estrogen blockers with testosterone, because either they don't understand the importance of estrogen in men or they need to cover up poorly treated or inconsistent testosterone levels.

Digestion by Design: Part 5

As we continue on our digestive journey, we arrive at that blessed moment when we typically stop thinking about food for a while. (Visit MyDestinLife.com for previous issues.) With enough food in the stomach, we no longer feel hungry and our minds tend to move on without much thought beyond feeling satiated. But, this is where things really start to get interesting.

As promised, here are a couple of simple food rules that may

help enhance digestion and nutrient absorption:

Rule #1: "The thing about fruit that you might not have known, it likes to be first and be eaten alone."

Yep, I just pulled a Dr. Suess and rhymed at you and here's why: Science used to believe we were all "set in stone" in early childhood, but now recognizes that neuroplasticity is a fact. Neuroplasticity refers to the ability of your brain to change throughout your life, capable of both restructuring and reorganizing.

One of the most effective ways to get new information to override the old is through repetition and rhyme.

So, back to our first rule: Fruit does not play well with others digestively. Though you might have learned otherwise, fruit is NOT a good side dish and it makes a terrible dessert. The reason has to do with digestive requirements. According to our programming, different foods need different amounts of time in the stomach before they move on. For example, proteins need up to three hours, but most fruits need 30 minutes or less.

When eaten alone, fruit will exit the stomach rather quickly and continue digesting in the small intestine where the nutrients are easily accessed. When eaten with or after other foods, fruit becomes trapped in your stomach. This is a problem, because when fruits break down, they release sugar. These sugars then feed the ever-present bacteria in your stomach, which can lead to digestive distress and the creation of unwanted toxins.

Like most rules, there are some exceptions: Combining fruit with specific healthy fats, in a smoothie for example, is allowed. Also, fruit eaten with fermented proteins like kefir, yogurt or cottage cheese is permitted. These particular foods won't prevent the fruit from leaving the stomach or lead to the creation of unwanted toxins. Further, the protein and/or fat content provide an additional advantage of slowing the release of fruit sugars into the bloodstream, helping maintain steady blood sugar levels.

Mainly you want to avoid eating fruit as a side dish or as a dessert.

Rule # 2: Dense protein with starch can taste good but, BEWARE! They need different enzymes; they're not a good pair!

Combining fruit, vegetable, starch, protein and fat, along with a big glass of milk, at ANY meal is a digestive nightmare! Yet many of us were taught that this is balanced for every meal. To enhance digestion and nutri-



ent absorption, it is best to eat dense proteins like meat, fish or poultry and dense starches like rice, potato, pasta or bread, SEPARATELY and here's why:

Proteins require an acid medium of digestive enzyme; starches require an alkaline medium of digestive enzyme. As you may recall from chemistry class, when we combine acid and alkaline, we get a neutral solution. Similarly, when we eat protein and starch in the same meal, both enzymes are released and the digestive solution is effectively neutralized. As a result, it is less efficient at breaking down your foods properly.

"No steak with potato? No chicken and rice? It's better with veggies or salad is nice!"

As an experiment, begin working with your perfectly designed system. Start planning meals that have any form of protein surrounded by a variety of non-starchy vegetables and/ or a green leafy salad. Do not include any bread, potato, rice or pasta with your meal. Does this mean no meat sandwiches, no hamburger and fries? YES, that's what it means. To improve health and expedite weight loss, you are better off surrounding your protein with fresh vegetables and leaving the starch for another time.

Starches ultimately break down into sugar. So, if weight loss is a goal, I recommend limiting them and having them earlier in the day. Like protein, if you choose to eat a starch, pair it with a variety of non- starchy vegetables.

Luke Air Force Base is located 9:12 a.m., a perfectly timed four-ship flyby of F-16s from the 63rd Fighter Squadron at Luke Air Force Base flew over the grave of Capt. Jeremy Fresques. Captain Fresques was an Air Force officer who was previously stationed at Luke Air Force Base and was killed in Iraq on May 30, Memorial Day.

At 9 a.m. on June 15, his family and friends gathered at Sunland Memorial Park in Sun City to mourn the loss of a husband, son and friend. Based on the letter writer's recount of the fly by, and because of the jet noise, I'm sure you didn't hear the 21gun salute, the playing of taps, or my words to the widow and parents of Capt. Fresques as I gave them their son's flag on behalf of the President of the United States and all those veterans and servicemen and women who understand the sacrifices they have endured.

Should You be Considering Preferred Stocks?

Investors have grown increasingly concerned about yields on their fixed income and more conservative investments. Preferred stocks, often overlooked, but obtainable through a brokerage account via many investment firms, are one option that they might want to consider now. The reason? Preferred stocks currently have yields between 5% and 6%. Today an investor can buy preferred stocks individually or through mutual funds or exchange traded funds.

It was a little more than a year ago that interest rates finally started to climb again. The Federal Reserve cited an improving economy and, thus, started shrinking its balance sheet (read that to mean decreasing the amount of cash in the system in the USA). The balance sheet had swollen to almost \$4.5 trillion and it let it shrink (by not renewing or buying more bonds) to around \$4 trillion. That was accompanied by a steady increase in the federal funds rate from near zero to somewhere between 2.25-2.50%. And most people thought that was going to be the trend for some time. In fact, one major U.S. banking executive predicted a 5% rate sometime this year or next. Of course, the world is a lot different in such a short period of time. Interest rates have softened. As a matter of fact, the 10-year U.S. Treasury actually now yields closer to a one-year Treasury. The result? Investors (needing or wanting to acquire more income or needing or to lower the risk to their portfolio) are left with choices that while lower risk or conservative, produce lower yields than investors need or want.

When adding conservative or fixed income investments, the least risky choices are savings accounts and CDs. Those are followed by Treasury bills and notes, money market mutual funds and finally fixed rate or fixed index annuities. Most of these types of investments produce in the 2-2.5% range. Right around or slightly behind the rate of inflation. This has many investors looking for more choices and these now include the attractive, but often overlooked, world of preferred stocks. Most preferred stocks today yield in the 5-6% range and can be held directly or through a mutual fund or exchange traded fund.

What are preferred stocks? They are stocks issued by companies and they carry a par (and maturity) value of \$25. They also have a stated maturity. Many investors maintain that these stocks offer the best and the not so best of both the worlds of stocks and of bonds. A preferred stock can be considered a cross between a stock and a bond. The risk is higher than that associated with holding bonds (corporate bonds to be specific) but not as great as the risk that comes with holding a particular company's stock.

"Preferreds" get their name because they are often considered to have priority to common stock in that dividends for many issues are paid to preferred shareholders before they go to the common shareholders. They also have preferred status with regards to exercising rights should a company undergo liquidation. In other words, the bondholders get paid first then the preferred shareholders and then the common stock holders.

Other preferred facts: The world of these stocks is somewhat smaller than that of common stocks, with about \$250 billion circulating today. Preferreds offer daily liquidity because they trade like other stocks. Their prices however are more sensitive to the movement of interest rates but owners can also participate in the growth of a company as well.

Diversification is key. So, interested investors usually look to ensure that they have their risk spread among a number of sectors of the market. To find out if preferred stocks might fit your strategy, do your research or contact a financial advisor to learn more.

An Accident's Mission

Recently someone came up to me and asked if there was anything that could be done for a family member who had been involved in a very serious auto accident. As they began to explain the situation, it became clear that the accident not only affected the young adult involved, but the parent who was relaying the story too. As the story unfolded about that terrible day, the mom began to describe the impact being so severe that the woman's daughter was rushed away unconscious in an ambulance to the ER. Alone and being worked on by hospital staff, this just old enough to be out on her own daughter, regained consciousness to find herself face to face with a Sheriff. And who, after answering questions as they were fired off one after another, was left in such a state that college had to be put on hold.

Here's the facts:

• It was raining and the roads were slick.

• A truck pulled out in front of her daughter.

• Her daughter hit the vehicle in front.

• "Full Coverage" was in place for the daughter's car.

After things settled down a bit, the daughter's insurance company proceeded to pay for damages to the vehicle and driver in front, but then failed to compensate the insured daughter for her losses as believed covered in the policy. After going around and around with the carrier, the daughter was left with expenses and the carrier stood by their position, "NO, we won't pay for that." So what's a person to do and how do you protect yourself in a situation like this?

Here's some basic "Insurance Rules of Engagement:"

Know what type of policy you have – most people assume they're covered only to find out too late when they're not.

Keep Your Auto Id Cards, Registration, Emergency Contact Information together so those that need to know about



an accident can be notified quickly.

Be Your Own Defense – take photos, gather as much information as you can – speak to witnesses who might be around. (If this can't be done at the time, you can ask the police or sheriff's office to send a copy of the report which might identify witnesses to the event.)

When speaking to investigators of any kind, know that you can wait until you feel safe, secure and of sound mind to answer questions. You might want to have an attorney present.

Don't take no for an answer – just because the insurance company says "NO, we won't pay for that" doesn't mean "NO, we won't pay for that." What that means is, "NO, we won't pay for that until you prove to us why we should."

Although the story of this daughter hasn't turned out too well so far, perhaps a goodness that can come from this tragedy now is that it can be shared to better prepare and help those who could find themselves in a similar situation now or in the future. Sometimes the only thing we may see come from a tragedy is the experience of being able to help those suffering the same. And it's with that thought that this writing is dedicated to the tragedy this family has experienced, so that their experience might not be in vain, but used to help someone else in need.

Perhaps this accident was no accident at all...

WATER AND SUN

Even if it's a "water dog" breed, such as a Labrador retriever, that doesn't mean it's a good swimmer. Always supervise dogs in the pool.

Start off on the right paw by introducing water gradually. A good way is through Beach Dog Aqua Therapy, 141 Santa Barbara Ave., Santa Rosa Beach. It also helps relieve pain and stiffness.

REMINDERS

NEVER to leave a dog alone in the car – not for a second – even with the air conditioning running or the windows cracked. Within minutes on a typical Emerald Coast summer day, it can reach up to 120 degrees inside, killing a dog.

Walks should be limited to early morning or late evening. Take frequent breaks and offer plenty of water. Protect paws from burns with booties, or by walking on grass. Avoid pavement, concrete and sand.

Dogs also can get sunburned, particularly hairless breeds or ones with white or light fur. Use sunscreen formulated for dogs and protective canine clothing.

Watch for signs of heatstroke,



particularly in breeds with short muzzles, such as boxers, pugs and shih tzus: excessive panting, weakness, drooling, lethargy, vomiting, dark red gums, incoordination, rapid heartbeat and seizures.
