And that's what is so special about the 30A Songwriters Festival. On Jan. 14-17, South Walton will be transformed into a story-in-song paradise and the "hottest" mid-January mecca for music fans. And the best part? It's right in our backyard!

For the past 12 years, the 30A Songwriters Festival has attracted thousands of diehard, enthusiastic, live music fans from throughout the U.S. to listen to original songwriters spanning many genres of music perform their songs. Thirty featured venues all along Hwy. 30A will present more than 230 songwriters and 300+ solo, band and in-the-round performances throughout the weekend. 



"We have a program that patients can be admitted into if they qualify. If admitted, they're scheduled with a provider we feel best matches their needs. We're going to get our patients the help they need or get them where they need to go. We can connect them, supply options,



help them navigate, whether it's mental health integration or primary care, etc.," says Tim.

Doctors, physician assistants, nurse practitioners and licensed mental health counselors donate their time as their schedules allow as well as volunteer nurses and clinic volunteers, all a vital part of the clinic's backbone.



**OCSO** Provides Hospice Patients with Decorated Christmas Trees

Each year, the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office teams up with Emerald Coast Hospice to provide each patient with a small, hand-decorated Christmas tree. It started 14 years ago with just 25 Christmas trees. It started

with just 25 trees, but this year it grew to approximately 360 trees, enough to fill an entire room.

Each year deputies volunteer to take home a tiny tree to decorate as they choose. The trees, provided by an anonymous donor, are then gifted to **Emerald Coast Hospice patients** who face life-limiting illnesses in homes or facilities from Panama City to Crestview.

School resource officers decorate a bulk of the trees also, with students in local kindergarten



and elementary school classes applying their decorating skills as well. The Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office headquarters is then transformed into a site to behold with all the trees, complete with festive ornaments and creative decorations, filling a big room. Creativity has no boundaries and the trees are judged. Additionally, the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office Angel Tree program nearly tripled in size this year, with approximately 270 children set to receive gifts.

The **Gulfarium** is adding a new stadium and dolphin exhibit with three primary pool habitats-a show pool, exhibit pool (with a large split-level underwater viewing area) and encounter pool. The proposed show stadium will have an occupancy of 480 people and include stadium-style seating areas with overhead shade canopies. Okaloosa County commissioners approved the expansion that will include a new dolphin show stadium, dolphin encounter pool and dolphin viewing area. Plans are for the complex in the property's northwest portion to be expanded to more than 31,000 sq. ft. There are no plans to stop dolphin shows in the meantime. The current show stadium will be transformed into a new attraction when the project is over. Established in 1955, the Gulfarium not only provides family-oriented entertainment, it also facilitates conservation, research, education and community enhancement. For example: The C.A.R.E. Center has treated 640 endangered sea turtles; school field trips and hands-on experiences are ongoing as well as pier and beach clean-up events.





## **The Christmas Bird Count**

In 1900, Frank M. Chapman of the freshly formed Audubon Society proposed a new holiday tradition that would promote conservation by counting, rather than hunting, birds on Christmas Day. Then, he called it the "Christmas Bird Census" and that first year managed 25 counts thanks to the efforts of 27 focused birders (they counted about 90 species that first year). Over the years, this bird census has come to be known as the Christmas Bird Count (CBC), and it's the nation's longest-running community science bird project. Over the past century, these bird counts have helped biologists, researchers, wildlife agencies and avid birders study bird populations across North America. In fact, the idea of an annual bird count has spread and now takes place in over 20 countries across the Western Hemisphere including far-flung locales like Saipan and Guam to the west, and Paraguay to the south. Audubon maintains an interactive map with all the differfor each here: https://audubon. maps.arcgis.com/apps/View/ index.html?appid=ac275eeb-01434cedb1c-5dcd0fd3fc7b4C.

So, what exactly is a bird count? The CBC is an early-winter bird census where thousands of volunteers that make up different "circles" go out between December 14 to January 5 every year. Each circle, like Choctawhatchee Bay, will choose a single calendar day within those dates to count birds. Count volunteers follow specified routes through a designated 15-mile diameter circle, counting every bird they see or hear all day. (Helpful hint Okaloosa and Walton County residents: a pair of binoculars makes an excellent Christmas gift). However, the count is not just a species tally-all birds are counted all day, giving an indication of the total number of birds in the circle that day. Now in its second century, the CBC has evolved into more than a seasonal tradition.

The CBC data represents one of the only conservation tools available for assessing the long-term trends in bird populations of North America. To date, over 300 peer-reviewed articles have resulted from use of CBC data. It was also used as a basis for Audubon's 2014 report on the impact changing global temperatures are having on bird populations (you can see this fascinating report at www. audubon.org/climate/ survivalbydegrees) and was instrumental in the collaborative development of the report by the North American Bird Conservation Initiative and U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service. (Learn more at https://archive.stateofthebirds.org/state-of-thebirds-2009-report). Closer to home, the Choctawhatchee Bay circle encompasses parts of Fort Walton Beach, Destin, Shalimar, Valparaiso, Niceville and Eglin AFB. The CBC Count Day for Choctawhatchee Audubon was December 18 where the tradition continued, but with some modifications to support a COVID-19 safe and socially distanced CBC.

Birders of all skill levels can volunteer in the CBC. If you are a beginning birder, you can be paired with local experts and if your home is within the boundaries of a CBC circle, then you can stay at home and report the birds that visit your feeder or yard on count day as long as you



have made prior arrangements. *Hot bird tip:* If you're just getting into birding, the free Audubon Guide to Birds in the app store is a great resource, as is Merlin Bird ID by Cornell Lab, part of Cornell University; recently, Merlin has added a Sound ID feature so you can identify birds near you based off their tweets. Another favorite is iBird Pro Guide to Birds, although that one isn't free.

Malcolm Swan and Bruce Purdy coordinate the Audu-

bon CBC circle in this worldwide citizen science event. The 15-mile-diameter circle is centered four miles North of the Marler (Destin) Bridge over East Pass, and the circle is divided into many sections for the different parties of observers. If you missed it this year, visit www. choctawhatcheeaudubon.org to download a pdf with bird ID tips and be ready for the 2022 Bird Count!

CAS hosts a number of outings each year. These include many bird walks, field trips, Fall and Spring Migratory Bird Counts, the Christmas Bird Count and a spring chapter retreat. Each year, special projects provide a chance to get outdoors and give back to the community at the same time. Last year, CAS volunteers monitored rooftop Least Tern nests and conducted a marine debris survey on Eglin AFB beaches. The Choctawhatchee Tern Team will resume nest monitoring operations in March.

The Choctawhatchee Audubon Society is a chapter of the National Audubon Society and is a non-profit, volunteer organization serving Okaloosa and Walton Counties (since 1976). ## Tom Rice Has a Nose for Business – And Charity

Our Hometown Hero, Tom Rice, has always loved three things: the restaurant business, charity and the U.S. Army. After 28 years in uniform, finishing as a First Sergeant, he retired from the military and made it a point to open his own restaurant, a journey which began when he was just a child.

"I worked in Perri's Italian Restaurant while I was in junior high school, high school and college," Rice, 72, said. "I loved it. I loved making pizzas and stirring the sauce."

Perri's, located on the site of the Fort Walton Beach Publix supermarket, later became Tom's first restaurant, a 1950s-style diner. "It was all chrome and glass," he said. Today, he's the owner of the Magnolia Grill, a unique eatery that is as much a museum of American history – particularly military history – on Brooks Street, which was moved from the original site to make way for Publix. But the Perri's influence remained.

"People kept coming in to

the restaurant and asking how to make Mr. Perri's recipes," Tom said. Today, he said, about 30 to 40 percent of Magnolia Grill's entrées are Italian.

To open the current Magnolia Grill, Tom bought a nearby house in 1999, which he moved to the current location 500 feet away. The move cost about \$50,000.

In 2001, the restaurant was open for business. "The renovation took 18 months, Tom said.

But Magnolia Grill is more than a business. In addition to the great food, the second floor contains artifacts from World War II, Vietnam and other segments of American history. But that's not the whole story.

Charities are among Tom Rice's pet projects. Whether it's pancake breakfasts aiding the Salvation Army, help for Catholic Charities or other needed and altruistic enterprises, Tom is dedicated to helping to make a difference. He serves as the secretary for Catholic Charities and chairman with the Salvation Army. "We've been given a golden opportunity here," Tom said. "Once in a while, someone will come to us for help. If they're willing to do some work, I donate pancake mix." He also donates sweat equity from his family members. For example, his brother-in-law served as Santa Claus during a recent pancake breakfast for the Empty Stocking Fund of the Salvation Army. He's also helped Disabled American Veterans, and worked on cemeteries for Memorial Day and Veterans Day, providing flags and chairs for those functions. "When the DAV folded in 2010, we continued with the ceremonies," Tom said. He

also assisted with the construction of the bell tower at Beal Cemetery, a 30-foot-tall edifice, which was completed in time for the 9/11 commemoration in 2014, including the casting of a 300-pound bell, cast in Ohio. The entire project cost about \$500,000, all of which was donated by locals. No government aid was needed.

Tom was part of the founding board of Fisher House of the Emerald Coast, which provides a home away from home for military families to live in during treatments for serious illness or physical or occupational therapy. It's within easy walking distance of the Eglin Air Force Base Hospital and Veterans' Clinic. "There are resources being in business," Tom said.

Tom and his wife, Peggy, have been married for 40 years. They have a daughter, Meghan Gordon, who serves with the ministry at Crosspoint church.

"Life is short," Tom said. "Make it count. Teach the value of giving. It's not always money. It's also time and talent."

## Is the Medicare Open Enrollment Period Important to You?

Now that the Medicare Annual Election Period (AEP) is over (ended December 7th), you can finally take a breather from all those ads, phone calls and mailers. As of January 1st, you have a chance to try out your new Medicare Advantage, Supplement and/or Prescription plan. If you suddenly discover the plan you selected during the AEP is not right for you, all is not lost. You will get one more bite at the apple to make changes to your plan.

As with many situations, in order to get a good outcome, you first have to ask the right questions. In this case, the questions you should ask first are:

• Did you sign up for a new Advantage Plan or a standalone Part D prescription drug plan during the last Annual Enrollment Period (AEP)?

• Do you have an existing Advantage Plan or a stand-alone Part D prescription drug plan that renewed with a January 1st effective date?

If the answer to either of these questions is yes, then the

Medicare Open Enrollment Period (OEP) is very important to you.

The OEP runs annually from January 1st to March 31st.

During this time, Advantage plan holders are given the option to make certain changes to the plan they selected in the AEP.

These allowed changes are: • Cancel your stand-alone Part D prescription drug plan.

• Drop your Medicare Advantage Plan and return to

Original Medicare (A & B only).
Enroll in a stand-alone Medicare Part D prescription drug plan.

• Elect to change from one Medicare Advantage Plan to another.

Let's a look at each option a bit deeper. First, why would someone elect to cancel their stand-alone Part D prescription plan? The only reason one could have would be it was being replaced by other qualifying coverage. If you cancel without replacing, penalties will accrue and be waiting for you when you do put this coverage back in place at a later date. Plus, those penalties will be with you for life!



You don't need any reason to switch plans provided you do so before the OEP expires on March 31st. Just remember, you only get one chance to make this change. Once you do, you will have to keep that plan until the next AEP, which begins on October 15th of every year.

The best options for your particular situation should be thoroughly discussed with your insurance agent/broker to make sure you have all the facts about the choices you may be thinking about and, get all your questions answered.

## The Ever-Changing Insurance Market Place in Florida

It has been two years since we wrote about the changing insurance market place in Florida. Because we are nearly surrounded by water with the possibility of storms and other natural disasters so evident, the cycles are much more pronounced.

Typically, insurance industry cycles will last anywhere between two to ten years. The market cycles rely on the way the nation, and for that matter the world, is operating, in addition to storms and other natural disasters, COVID has impacted the marketplace. In this edition we will take a condensed look at what factors are driving these market shifts, the differences of a hard and soft market, and the effect on your personal and business insurance programs.

In a **soft market**, there will be an increase in competition and pressure on lowering premiums. This cycle is usually followed by a hard market because carriers are underpricing coverage to secure market share. In a soft market you can usually find lower insurance costs, broader coverages and more liberal underwriting guidelines. This is an advantage for anyone who is purchasing insurance. With increased capacity, the consumers have more Insurance carriers and enhancements to choose from to design their insurance program. A soft market increases the amount of competition between insurance companies.

A **hard market** is a time when premiums increase while capacity or the ability to write more premiums is diminished. These past two years for the Florida insurance market have certainly been one for the records. Higher premiums, more



stringent underwriting and less competition is playing into the advantage of insurance carriers, and make it difficult on consumers. This is a good time to have a comprehensive insurance review.

COVID has definitely impacted the insurance industry as well. The pandemic has certainly highlighted coverages that are included in contracts. Insurers have seen an increase in insurance claims while suffering investment losses. But there are other factors that should be mentioned that have added to the creation of the hard market that we are currently experiencing.

Florida's hard insurance market is tougher than any other market cycle in most other states. The challenges are exacerbated by other "unique" market conditions such as natural disasters, litigation, fraud and increase in claims frequency and severity. Many carriers are still working through their losses from the natural disasters, and the major storms of Hurricane Irma in 2017 and Hurricane Michael in 2018. These two events had a major impact on the rising reinsurance costs. Reinsurance is an essential product, purchased by insurance carriers to mitigate catastrophic exposures.


Fraud is another factor impacting the insurance market. The more prevalent schemes are related to assignment of benefits from some roofing contractors and mold remediation companies. Another factor impacting the Florida industry is the escalation of litigation in our state. There are some public adjusters teaming up with personal injury attorneys to file frivolous claims creating unnecessary litigation. One recent study shows that 8% of all homeowners' claims nationwide are in the State of Florida, but 76% of all homeowners' claims lawsuits are in

the State of Florida!

Whether you are seeking personal or business insurance, navigating the market can be challenging. The bottom line for the Florida insurance market right now is that the industry is on life support and consumers are facing double digit rate increases. Policyholders are paying more money for less coverage. Regardless of what you're after, it's important to find an insurance professional who can help you manage your insurance program during the market cycles. An independent agent with multiple carriers should be of great assistance in any market.

## Car Shopping The Smart Way: How to Land The Right Preowned Car at the Right Price

Whether you're shopping for your first car, truck or SUV or in the market for your 15th one, vehicle shopping can be a tedious chore, and that's especially true in today's automobile market.

There's often such a fine line between a really great deal and a really bad one, but the more you educate yourself ahead of time, the better the probability of you getting the car you need at a price that's right, along with dependable service and financing terms that you'll be happy about well after the new of your new (to you) ride wears off.

Preowned vs. New: There are often many incentives to buying preowned instead of new. The most obvious? "The right" used vehicle can usually save you money upfront, as well as save on insurance, registration and taxes. Perhaps the greatest reason buying preowned often makes sense, though, is that you get more car for less money. And if you buy right and get into a three-to-five year old model, a large chunk (usually around 45% to 60%) of the new car price depreciation was already absorbed by the previous owner.

I understand that there will always be advocates for buying

new, because, in theory at least, it's less hassle since a new car should have zero issues and very little maintenance needed for its first few years of ownership. However, that doesn't hold true near as much as it might have 20 years ago. Nowadays, most any modern car or truck (other than some high-end exotics) should easily be very dependable for well past 100,000 miles, with routine oil changes, tires and brakes. By contrast many brand-new cars will need the same things during your first three years of ownership, yet still burden you with a higher payment while also taking on those maintenance costs.

Here, I've compiled an overview on how to shop smart and get the right deal on the car, truck or SUV you really want when going the preowned route. Many of these steps can help assure your best deal when buying new, too.

**Know Your Needs:** Determine what vehicle you really want, and need, and look for that vehicle as opposed to simply blindly searching for whatever seems to be available. Remember, just because something is a good price, or in good condition, doesn't mean it's a good deal for you. Think about how



you plan to use the vehicle and what options you can do without and which ones you consider a must have. Make sure you have narrowed down a handful of vehicles that meet your need based on size, cargo capacity, EPA fuel mileage, reliability, cost of ownership, and a price range you can "really" afford without being car rich and cash poor.

You can, and should, research any vehicle you are considering, in detail, before buying the car. Don't rely on the salesperson at the dealership to do this. They can still help you find and close the best vehicle for you, but you need to do your own homework first.

It's important to know that even very reliable brands often have certain vehicles in particular year ranges and drivetrain

configurations that are problematic. For instance, I often buy Mercedes, BMW, Porsche and other Euro makes. However, there are certain cars from these brands I would not even consider because of particular problems that plagued certain models and years. This holds true with any make from a Ford F150 truck to a Jeep or Porsche, and even to Hondas, Hyundais and Toyotas, though, across the board, most of the Asian brands have proven to be the least problematic to maintain cost effectively, and in many cases the most reliable for the money. And, I'm saying this as someone who drives mostly European cars myself. The truth is, most all of us who consider ourselves real car fanatics understand that the more a brand costs, and the fewer of them there are on the road, the more the cost of ownership is going to be. It doesn't mean highline brands aren't cutting-edge engineering marvels and the most fun to drive, just that they also cost the most to drive.

**Set a Budget:** There are really only two ways to buy a vehicle: You either pay cash or you have a payment. Either way, try to refrain from buying more than what makes good financial

sense. It always puzzles me when I hear people complain about barely being able to make their payments, or not having money to do other things, because they are driving around in vehicles that are \$500 to \$1.000 a month. Most financial consultants agree that whether you are paying cash or financing (no matter how great of price you might have gotten at the time of purchase) the purchase price of your vehicle should be no more than 35% of your annual gross income. This means buying a \$50,000 vehicle if you're making \$100,000 a year doesn't make good financial sense. We all know A LOT of people who've fallen into the "keep up with the Joneses" trap of spending a high percentage of their take-home income on a single car payment. Even lenders consider anything more than 20% of your take-home earnings per month to be an excessive car payment. This doesn't mean vou can't be smart and still drive a car you like. In fact, you can often buy that same (or one body style back) vehicle that is three to five years old and have a payment that's around half of what other buyers who bought the same vehicle brand new are still paying for theirs.

Once you have a handful of particular cars in mind, use sites like NADA (National Auto Dealers Association) and Kelly Blue Book to research the current book value of the specific make, model and year you are looking for or have seen listed for sale. Remember to pay attention to the "retail value" and "private party value" when comparing prices. Know these values and let any dealership or individual seller know you have researched and know the value of what they are selling, if their price is for any reason higher than what the book value shows it should be.

There are big benefits to buying from a reputable dealer, and though you may sometimes pay slightly more than you would if you were buying the same vehicle from an individual, sometimes you will pay even less, and could get a car or truck that has recently been inspected and had routine maintenance and needed repairs already done. Ask about

this, and what has been done, along with any warranty they offer.

Get Pre-Approved: If you are financing, buying from a dealer is usually simpler than from a private seller. This is especially true if you have a trade-in. Though anyone with good credit can often borrow the money from their credit union, bank or various online auto lenders and get the same rate they would receive going through the dealer. Either way you go, it's a good move to get preapproved for an auto loan, because it simplifies the buying process and puts you in a stronger negotiating position at the dealership, since they will already know you can buy today, if they simply work the right deal for you.

**Go for a Test Drive:** Once you've located a vehicle you're interested in, go for a test drive. If the vehicle is at a dealership, this is pretty standard. However, if you're considering buying from a private seller, take precautions to meet at a safe place and preferably take someone else with you to meet the seller. Re-

member to ask questions about the vehicle's maintenance and condition, as well as their ownership experience and even why they are selling it.

Whether test driving a dealership's or individual seller's vehicle, make sure to get in a few miles of driving at highway speeds, as well as some turns, stops, hills and curves. It's best to do this with the entertainment system off (I know, I know... you want to know how good the stereo sounds) and with a keen ear and feel for any noises or unusual handling characteristics of the particular car or truck. Do all of the gauges function and measure where they should? Do the brakes squeak? How does the steering feel? Does the transmission shift out, up and down, smoothly? Do all of the windows and lights work properly? Does the sunroof, navigation and sunroof function as they should? Do all the signals work? How does the car feel starting and stopping? If anything seems out of place, ask about it.

**Check the Vehicle History Report:** Before you buy any preowned vehicle, ask the dealer to see a vehicle history report. If you're buying from an individual, it's usually worth the small fee to run it yourself if they don't have a recent one handy. Through companies like Carfax, AutoCheck, KBB and others, you can get a somewhat detailed history report using the vehicle's identification number. I say "somewhat detailed," because not all of the events such as services and repairs are always on the report, as some service centers and dealers report to Carfax and AutoCheck (or others) and some don't. So, don't be alarmed if you see random oil changes and services. What you are really looking for here are irregular title issues, major body repairs, number of owners, along with mileage discrepancies. I wouldn't be too concerned with small repairs like bumper covers or a headlight or taillight replacement, but you should note, from the report, where the damage was and whether listed as minor or severe. The truth is a lot of cars have some small blemishes on these reports from minor occurrences that don't otherwise impair the vehicle once properly repaired. I'd even go so far as to say that there are some rebuilt salvage title vehicles that are great dependable cars, after being repaired correctly and inspected by the title issuing state and given a clean bill of acknowledgement. Still, these cars -no matter how great of condition—are normally worth 25% to 40% less than the same exact vehicle, with the same mileage, and a clean title.

Talk Price: This is the part that so many people dread. However, it's also the part that can make a lot of difference in whether you go home with a good deal or a bad one. Though a lot of modern dealerships do operate on a no negotiation basis where the price is set in relation to what the true retail book value is, this isn't always the case with every dealer, and certainly isn't with private sellers. This is why you did your homework, and you know the value of the vehicle yourself.

Let's say the seller is asking \$18,900 and your detailed research shows the vehicle is worth \$16,400. Use your negotiation skills to point that out. Let's face it, unless you're walking, and can't find another car for sale within a 50-mile radius, it wouldn't make sense to overpay for the car, no matter how much you like it. Remember, this isn't a house. This is a constantly depreciating asset. If you overpay for it today, you will over owe for it for a long time. Use this as a time to bring up any small imperfections in the vehicle or anything you noticed in the inspection or test drive. After doing that, simply make an offer such as: I really like the car, but I am not willing to pay over what the value is for the car. I will offer you \$16,000, but I can't go any more than that. Now, be willing to buy or walk. Maybe they come back at the \$16,400 it's worth. If so make the deal. Remember: If you are buying from a dealership, they also have set dealer fees. These often range from \$400 to \$900, and are called a variety of different names such as "doc fees" or "documentation fees," but the closest one to truth is "dealer profit." It's completely fine and part of the process to pay these, and most dealers have learned not to budge on these fees, as their margins have gone down over the past decade, and they actually need them to survive in many cases. Just know that when figuring a final outthe-door price, that fee, and your


## Not Sitting on the Sidelines of Life







Destin's first food hall soon— City Food Hall. It will offer a culinary and entertainment gathering place for locals and visitors, as well as a unique opportunity for our area's up-and-

#### coming and veteran chefs.

I caught up with City Food Hall founders Peter Rounce and Kenzie Motai to help shed some light on what we're in store for and what drew them to Destin!

Kenzie says he initially didn't understand how beautiful and how popular our lucky little fishing village is, but when they visited, they fell in love with the area. "We did a lot of market research and that's one of the reasons why we're happy to be in Destin; it's probably the #1 family destination and we're a one-stop shop for each family member's palette. And Destin Commons provides an ideal environment for us to capture both visitor and local traffic. We are proud to be part of such a quali-

So, this spring you might find yourself surrounded by more than 10 specialty restaurant concepts, (no dining options repeat) offering food and drinks from around the globe, an expansive indoor/

outdoor bar, and two state-ofthe-art Top Golf full swing simulators with a variety of multisport games, several HDTVs and comfortable lounge seating.

"City Food Hall will be Destin's newest go-to gathering place," says Kenzie. "After the challenges of 2020 and 2021, we wanted to create a community destination where friends and family can spend time together sharing great food and drinks with a side of entertainment. Our plan is to have entertainment every single night, with live music every weekend," he says.

But Kenzie and Peter feel the real draw will be the connections people make. "This food hall concept in and of itself is a great family night, but also a great date place," says Peter. "The food hall environment is for everyone passionate about food and connecting. Further, people are drawn to the brand Top Golf. "Though it's a really fun activity, the food and drinks at that venue are also very good, thereby drawing folks in and allowing them to connect," says Kenzie.

"It will be possible to rent out the entire food hall space, which can become very interactive with a food passport, for example. We can get very creative with those types of events."

Kenzie says the food hall concept enables his team to "bring new culinary talent to the Destin table," and they have begun discussions with area chefs specializing in Mexican, Japanese, Mediterranean and other cuisines. Peter explains how the vendors will be chosen. "We always try to stay as local as possible. The popular ones are doing something that speaks to the local community. Then once we bring in that type of cuisine, we won't duplicate it." For some vendors, it might be their first concept and they're able to initiate it in a non-threatening environment, they explain. "The menus presented will always be specific to them and in no con-



flict with any other restaurant or eatery," says Peter.

"There's definitely some regular, normal food items we always seek out for the food hall, but we also seek out the area's specific tastes and desires for the people in the area," Kenzie says. "What are people doing in the area? We explore those possibilities. Culture fit? Good food? Do they work well with everyone else?"

City Food Hall at Destin Commons will be located in a 14,000 square-foot space next to Foot Locker. The food hall itself is a turnkey space and 4800 sq. ft. of cooking space within. Vendors will be assigned their own prep area, somewhat like a commissary kitchen. "It's a shared environment with 10 food stalls. Half are hot stalls (hooded) and half are cold stalls (not hooded) with point of sale units there for each," says Peter. "All they need is their own staff and their own food. We have the permits."

Peter says technology is one of the new things. "You can order from different vendors, even order directly from your table, but only have to pay with one check or credit card; it will all be centralized. You'll also be able to order from your phone via the City Food Hall website and execute all transactions digitally."

"We take pride in the vendors and caliber of chefs we're pulling in," says Peter. "The vendors can perfect their business concept and it's touching for us, because we are able to play a part in it and it's a sense of pride," says Peter. "We'll have a really wonderful bar program there, too. We want to showcase the food on a beautiful plate in an upscale, casual setting. Your experience can be long or short time-wise."

City Food Hall is planning to hire roughly 30-40 employees and vendors will hire their own.

## Off the Hook: No Boat? No Problem!

In our lucky little fishing village, it might be perceived that a boat is necessary to catch certain kinds of fish or a multitude of fish. However, without access to a boat, there are still some great ways that anglers can take advantage of (even some who

will rent rods if you don't have your own!) And, it's a great winter activity in our area. So, grab your rods and reels as we head out to explore some active spots to fish in Destin.

Probably the most popular and first thought of a fishing spot without a boat is our white sand beaches. With miles stretching across the Emerald Coast, there is no shortage of spots to fish but a few key factors could help you be more successful. When searching for a spot, look for a more secluded area where there are less swimmers. Also, check the water for color changes and wave breaks as that will signify better feeding spots for the fish. Try to find a spot where two sandbars meet and post up in the middle of them. Popular fish caught off the beach include pompano, redfish, bluefish, ladyfish, black drum and jack crevalle.

Pier fishing is another hot spot in our local area, and we have two within driving distance

- The Okaloosa Island Pier or the Navarre Beach Pier. Both piers stretch almost a quarter mile into the Gulf of Mexico and anglers of all skill levels can try their luck. Most frequent catches from the pier include Spanish mackerel, whiting, sheepshead, ladyfish and bluefish, but some noteworthy fish have been caught there as well. Cobia, king mackerel, tuna, even Tarpon weighing over 100lbs and a few Sailfish have been pulled up from the water. Redfish and pompano are also frequent catches in this area. Both piers have a tackle shop on site that will also rent rods and reels, so even the novice angler can spend a day trying their luck.

A new spot to try is Thomas Pilcher Park, located under the 331 Bridge. There is plenty of parking, bathrooms and a variety of spots to cast a line. There is a bait shop down the road before the bridge that you can pick up tackle, bait and anything else you'll need to get started. This is also a good spot to launch a paddleboard or kayak if you want to try fishing the shallow water along the shoreline, around the docks and grass flats.

In any of these locations, the best time of year to fish is from March-November, but fish will bite all year long if we have a warm winter. The bite is also always best when the tide is rising or falling and it's common to see fish start to school up along the beaches.

If you are looking for a little more guidance while fishing, there are a variety of private charters or party boat options available to book in our area. Private charters are a flat rate small group fishing, whereas a party boat is more affordable and priced per person. Our lucky little fishing village makes it easy to get on the water!

## Fourth Sculpture Installation Planned for Underwater Museum of Art

The Cultural Arts Alliance of Walton County (CAA) in partnership with the South Walton Artificial Reef Association (SWARA) join two of South Walton's most cherished resources, the arts and the Gulf of Mexico, with the Underwater Museum of Art (UMA). Named by TIME Magazine as one of 100 of the "World's Greatest Places," the UMA is the first and only permanent underwater sculpture museum in the U.S. located off the coast of Grayton Beach State Park in South Walton.

The UMA has been featured in online and print publications including National Geographic, Lonely Planet, Travel & Leisure, Newsweek, The New York Times and more. As part of the CAA's Art In Public Spaces program, the UMA also augments SWARA's mission of creating marine habitat and expanding fishery populations while providing enhanced cultural, economic and educational opportunities for the benefit, education and enjoyment of area residents, including students and visitors. The project is supported by Visit South Walton, the National Endowment for the Arts, Visit Florida, The Alys Foundation and the Florida Department of State, Division of Arts and Culture.

Artist applications are in and the CAA has obtained a panel of arts and marine environment specialists to review the applications and select proposals for completion and installation. They will be considering a demonstrated history of collaboration completing large- and small-scale public art projects. Then the selected artists will be commissioned to develop design proposals and create a 3D piece of original artwork to be permanently installed in the Underwater Museum of Art. Each artist will receive a \$6,500 stipend inclusive of design fees, materials, labor, fabrication, construction, packing materials, shipping and transportation.

Once selections are made, artists will be notified and have approximately five months to complete and deliver work to Walton County where the completed sculptures will be



exhibited on land before being transported to Walter Marine in Orange Beach, Ala., to be attached to custom pedestals. Sculptures will then be taken by barge to the Gulf and carefully submerged at roughly 60 feet to the floor of the Gulf of Mexico.


The UMA is produced in conjunction with SWARA's existing USACOE and FDEP permitted artificial reef project that includes nine nearshore reefs located within one nautical mile of the shore in approximately 60 feet of water. The first phase of the UMA project included seven pieces of sculpture installed in June 2018 with the second phase of ten more sculptures deployed in June 2019 and the third phase, which was postponed due to the pandemic, of eight sculptures was successfully deployed in February 2021 bringing the total number of UMA sculptures to 25.

Through the CAA's Art on Demand program and in partner-

ship with Alys Beach, 30A.com, Dive30A and Florida Department of State, Division of Arts and Culture, the sculptures are periodically highlighted with a virtual Art on Demand event where you can discover this buried treasure. The most recent episode highlighted how this permanent sculpture garden came to exist from concept to creation and all points in between. The sculptures quickly attract a wide variety of marine life and, over time, metamorphize into a living reef providing a much-needed habitat for local marine life and fisheries as well as providing marine scientists, wildlife management professionals, ecologists, and students, with an opportunity to study marine life and measure the impact of artificial reef systems on the Gulf ecosystem.

## Can I Get Some Motivation Please?!?

"Don't wait until everything is just right. It will never be perfect. There will always be challenges, obstacles and less than perfect conditions. So, what? Get started now. With each step you take, you will grow stronger and stronger, more and more skilled, more and more self-confident and more and more successful." ~Mark Victor Hanson, motivational author.

It's 2022... where do you see yourself? We all have the same choices to make; to stay just as we are or bust down the barriers holding us back from what we know we need. Your health is a GIFT. Some capitalize on that gift, but many don't. Finding the motivation we need can be challenging. We set new resolutions in our minds, but then what happens? Are you being too vague? Need a little help?

Take specific actions like finding a workout partner or group and set a time that is most feasible. A study by the Society of Behavioral Medicine showed that working out with a partner, especially in a team format, improved performance, double enhancing the workout of those who exercised alone. One study found that 95% of those who started a program with friends completed the program, compared to 76% completion in those who tried the program alone. The friend group was also 42% more likely to maintain their weight loss. A partner can be a friend, group of friends, or a personal trainer. Accountability and camaraderie are the reason it's so effective.

Group training or partner training is also a way to split costs, making it more affordable to stick with a trainer or structured program for a longer period of time. Find a group fitness class at a gym. The regular participants will become your friends and accountability partners. Also, a study published in the International Journal of Stress Management states that subjects that exercised with a friend felt calmer, had more fun and raised more endorphins, thus giving a more energized mood boost to complete the exercises. Welcome 2022! A recent survey of 531 U.S. adults showed the top resolutions are: exercise more, eat healthier and save money. A look back 20 years, and CNN's poll showed the top resolutions were: get out of debt, lose weight and develop a healthy habit (quit smoking). It's not surprising that the top resolutions are similar year after year, because they all have great intentions and actually go hand and hand. Let's look at eating healthier and exercising. Eating healthy can mean cooking more at home, which saves money. Eating healthy also could cause fewer medications or doctor visits, which saves money. is not a phrase from Tom Wolfe's novel the Right Stuff, but a term used to describe a system. The building envelope is the physical barrier between the exterior and interior environments enclosing a structure (your home). Generally, the building envelope is comprised of a series of components and systems such as a roof, walls, windows and a foundation. These systems protect the interior from the effects of the environment like precipitation, wind, temperature, humidity and ultraviolet radiation. One function of the building envelope is to control these effects between the interior and exterior of the building. When there is missing or compacted insulation or unsealed windows, doors and attic penetrations, your building envelope is compromised, wasting energy and comfort.

If your home is older than 10 years, you most likely don't have enough insulation to meet today's guidelines. Prior insulation code for this area was R-19 (roughly 6.5" of insulation); now the new code is R-30 (roughly 10.5" of insulation). That's a 61% increase. Why the increase? Because we know that R-19 insulation has trouble keeping our homes comfortable and the only solution was to add more insulation. More states are requiring the use of a reflective radiant barrier insulation installed on the attic rafters. Reflective radiant barriers reflect 97% of radiant heat in your attic, lowering the attic temperature by 40 to 50 degrees in the summer allowing your insulation and ductwork to perform better, saving you money and increasing your comfort. It's all about tightening the envelope to increase efficiency and comfort. If one of your resolutions is to save money this year, schedule an inspection to know exactly where your home could improve its envelope.

Because hearing is passive, we hear noises around us all the time and don't react, but listening...listening is an art – more accurately, a skill. Now, because we hear that a lot nowadays, we get used to those disclaimers and really don't hear the nuance of what's being stated: "By listening to this message and continuing this call, YOU consent to OUR listening to and the recording of everything you are going to say; and what you say, can, and will be used in our investigation of your claim."

This article isn't a scare article or an article about how big and bad insurance companies are. On the contrary, the reason I wanted to write this piece is to help people understand that words are powerful, powerful enough to cause good claims to go bad and get denied because someone said something that someone else didn't agree on.

For your reading please.... here's a snippet from a common insurance policy:

As stated in 7C, an examination under oath is exactly what it means, an examination under oath (commonly known as depositions) where everything you have, are and will say are being recorded to later be fact checked, further investigated, used to determine whether or not those being deposed will make for good witnesses (for or against the claim), and whether or not, based on the testimony and other "evidences" collected, if this claim should defended in court with a jury of peers or settled now.

On the side of the insurance companies, active listening is a skill that carrier reps and adjusters are well versed in. There is a great deal of training on how to listen to an insured telling their side of events, and how to interpret what the adjuster has just heard, against non-verbal clues that may be telling a different story. This is the first line of defense for a carrier against fraud. And because insurance fraud is real, methods on detecting fraud are paramount to an insurance carrier's health and solvency.

This is important, because unless a policy is a named peril policy, all other insurance policies provide coverage for everything (unless excluded). And when a claim is filed, it is not the duty of the insured to prove what happened for coverage to be granted, but the duty of the insurer (your

The U.S. economy is on a tear so to speak. Economic growth is considered by some to be beyond red hot (Fidelity recently called it "white hot"). Corporate profits have been growing at record paces, despite higher prices for materials and labor. Yes, American companies are continuing to make record profits despite the biggest spikes in inflation in almost 40 years. So, many are wondering, can it continue? That 'it' is economic growth and along with-it productivity, profitability and ultimately stock prices, real estate prices and other asset prices.

Americans continue to increase their spending (U.S. companies, too) and they continue to increase their savings. Access to capital has never been so advantageous to corporate America, its citizens and its governments. Is that what has been driving inflation? Some argue it has not. They argue it is the (temporary) disruptions in the supply chain that is causing significant spikes for everything from semiconductors (computer chips) to clothing, building materials, and just about everything that relies upon shipping and delivery.

We, along with everyone else, hear and see a lot of what is going on and draw conclusions and formulate opinions. We will share them with you in this edition of Research and Commentary from The First Wealth Management.

We think it is going to take a lot to significantly slow down this economy and start to hurt corporate earnings. Starting with inflation, we think that it will sustain itself at 5% (not the 3.5% that the market is implying or the 6.8% of the Consumer Price Index). That rate by the way is more than double—in fact it is almost triple—what inflation has been in the past 20 years or so. Inflation at these levels can threaten productivity

and profitability for sure. However, we think not enough in this scenario to reduce profit growth below 10%. We aren't alone in this thinking, but it makes a lot of sense to us. Stock prices would benefit commensurably in this scenario. Stock prices tend to follow profits or profit growth, but some stocks get way ahead of themselves and get overvalued (Electric vehicle stocks or crypto exchange companies, for example). Some stocks continue to suffer a lack of interest or momentum and hence become undervalued. Believe it or not, energy stocks are still considered to be undervalued even though the sector is up over 50% for the year.

Next, the money supply. Fed stimulus and the growth of the balance sheet would have to slow down significantly or even reverse. It is important to point out that the Fed has slowed its pace of asset purchases (which has been increasing the money supply, kept rates low, created greater liquidity, made credit more available) but still has continued to grow its balance sheet and the money supply. Banks, as most depositors know, are not trying to increase deposits through higher rates on savings and CDs. Banks have access to a lot of capital. One reason bank stocks have performed strongly, and we think overall the sector will continue to do so, is simply put this way: Bank profitably grows when banks borrow on the short end (at close to zero) and lend on the long end (not close to zero, more like 3% and beyond). So, if rates or yields do go up, banks might grow their revenues and their profits more quickly.

The role that the Fed plays probably shouldn't be understated. Recently Global X (an investment management company of exchange traded funds) called 2020 the year of the virus, 2021 the year of inflation and 2022 the year of The Fed. We tend to agree. They went on to say that yields and economic growth will be key focuses for the Fed. That included commentary on which sectors rise with an increasing 10-year U.S. Treasury note rate and oil prices: Those are Financial Services (banks and financial services), energy (mainly oil companies but also oil services and energy transportation) and Industrials. Industrials encompasses a lot: Transportation (air, freight, rail, trucking) auto and equipment manufacturers, defense companies among others).

Economic contractions (recessions and depressions) are the result of restriction of credit. That is not happening right now and hence has been the wind in the sails of the economy. Left unchecked, however, that can lead to prices rising too rapidly (inflation), but also it can lead to asset bubbles. A greater supply of money pushes asset prices up and leads to higher levels of speculation. Question for readers to ponder: Is crypto currency a store of value and hence its rapid rise or is it also impacted by speculation because of the huge increase in the money supply? We think it is the latter and that investors should take caution when considering crypto as part of their asset mix.

What about Covid? Approximately 62% of the U.S. population is vaccinated. As newer variants emerge, will they evade vaccinations, cripple mobility, demand and ultimately economic growth? We think the proof is in the lockdowns or the lack thereof. Most governments and nations tend to be looking to how to live and continue to grow through this virus and begin to accept it as part of life in these times. We think that Covid will continue to temper economic growth (and even take a point or two out of inflation), but not freeze it or reverse it.

Because of economic growth the demand for energy (green or fossil fueled) will continue to grow. World demand for liquified natural gas alone (to generate electricity, heating and cooking) is seeing significant increase and now some are projecting that the U.S., within the next year, will be the leading exporter of the fuel. Areas of the world, namely Europe, pronounce that its energy mix will be close to 80% green energy by the end of this decade. Energy stocks and funds represent less than 3% of the value of the S&P 500. While their profitability and stock prices have grown, they still don't have anywhere near the percent of the market as say technology stocks do at 27%.

Also, don't forget about infrastructure growth. There are industries, companies and sectors that could be the benefactors (along with their shareholders) of the significant investments being made into infrastructure (roads, bridges, 5G, railroads, the shoring up of flood zones and rising sea levels). There are mutual funds, exchange traded funds and individual stocks that investors could look at if they see this as an area of growth and profitability.

Regarding productivity: How can corporate America, and the corporate world keep up with higher costs of materials and labor shortages (inputs). Labor shortages are likely to continue because so many people have left the workforce, population growth has slowed significantly, and the worker participation rate is near its lowest level in history. We think the advances being made every day in automation, artificial intelligence and outsourcing - when juxtaposed with higher cost of labor — deliver that badly needed productivity to remain or grow profitability. The Kiplinger Letter recently cited the demand and growth of so called cobots, or collaborative robots, that "work side by side with workers" as one example of technology boosting or improving productivity. This could be an answer to the not only the growing cost of labor but the shortage of labor as well. Investors have more access than ever to directly participate in these technologies or sub sectors through individual securities or through the funds that represent them.

In the end, until there is an opposing shift, we believe the economy will continue to grow.




When closing the deal, you'll also be asked about additional purchases such as gap insurance and extended warranties. These are not bad purchases to consider–especially if you are financing the car. Before you agree to any extended warranty, however, know about any existing manufacturer's warranty or dealer warranty that the car may still be under, and decide accordingly, based on the vehicle's age, mileage and condition, whether you are likely to justify the cost of an extended warranty (often \$1,400 to \$2,000 or more) versus potentially having to pay for potential repairs yourself. Personally, I've only purchased an extended warranty once in over 30 years of owning various cars. Even then, it wouldn't pay the simple \$400 part that went

out on my Jeep at the time. So, I forgo those, but do put a lot of merit into cars with existing CPO manufacturer's warranties, though they don't cover routine maintenance items.

If you've made it this far, done your due diligence, and followed all the steps herein, you're likely to be able to head home in a preowned vehicle you really like, and one you can feel good about not only the day you buy it, but also three months or a year later when the new has worn off a little and it's settled into being another one of your "things," just like those favorite worn jeans, old Chuck Taylors, or that TAG watch you spent two week's pay for 10 years ago.


# What Ever Happened to Hope?

# The 10 Best Films of 2021 and Where to Stream Them

1. West Side Story (Steven Spielberg, \*\*\*\*)



What happens when arguably the best filmmaker of all time (Steven Spielberg) joins with one of the great playwrights of our day (Tony Kushner [Angels in America; Caroline, or Change]), to reimagine a musical by some of the greatest musical theater lyricists and composers (Stephen Sondheim and Leonard Bernstein), based on a play by one of the greatest writers of all time (Shakespeare)? You get this sizzling but savy West Side Story, the best film of the year.

It pays tribute to its predecessor, but fixes several of its problems (such as white actors in brown makeup; here all the Sharks are Latinx performers who speak Spanish), and then flies much higher. This film looks like it was made in 1957, but is really about us today.

Spielberg's eye, synergized with Janusz Kaminski's striking cinematography, from the demolished-lower-class opening crane shots, to the sweeping cameras of the dance, to the dramatic chiaroscuro lighting of Tony/Maria's first meeting, to the expressionistic god's-eyeview shots of the rumble, to the startling closing shot, make this film an instant masterpiece.

Leto Atreides (Oscar Isaac), and his mother, Jessica (Rebecca Ferguson). Little do they know that the planet's former capitalist exploiters of the spice mélange, led by Baron Vladimir Harkonnen (Stellan Skarsgard), have set a trap for them.

# FABA's Far West Chapter Sets Schedule

Are you interested in blacksmithing? Think about joining the Florida Artist Blacksmith Association (FABA). Its mission is to teach and preserve the noble art of blacksmithing.

Recently popularized by programs like "Forged in Fire" and "Men at Arms," blacksmithing has experienced a renaissance. However, FABA has been actively teaching and setting up historical blacksmith shops throughout Florida for the last 35 years. Part of the FABA educational program is to host monthly meetings in six locations throughout the state. Our local Far West chapter is headquartered at Traditions Workshop in Fort Walton Beach and sponsors meetings throughout the panhandle.

Your first meeting with FABA is always on us. After that, we encourage you to join this fine organization. For a family to



join, visit https://blacksmithing.org. The cost is only \$30 per family, per year. An annual membership allows your clan to participate at any FABA event throughout the state (usually one every weekend). Plus, you get an e-copy of the monthly newsletter, The Clinker Breaker, featuring Florida blacksmithing news and events.

The next two Far West meetings will be the fourth Saturday of January and February at Traditions Workshop, 418 Green Acres Rd, Fort Walton Beach, FL, 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. The January 22nd meeting will focus on the Journeyman standard to "Swage a tenon by making the end of a square bar round using a swage." It will also feature the task to "Make an assembly from at least two

separate pieces using a mortise and tenon." A typical project using these techniques is to make a trivet. We will have a spring swage and "monkey fist" available to accomplish these tasks.

The February 26th meeting will focus on splitting where the demonstrated task will be to split a bar with a hot cut at the end or in the middle of the bar. A barbecue fork uses this technique. In the far west, we always have open forges following the demonstration, so you can try your hand at the project for the day. Lunch is provided and donations appreciated

The March 26th Meeting (9

a.m.-3 p.m.) will be at John Butler's farm, 4112 Bell Lane, Pace. We are planning to conduct this meeting as a "make and take" class: How to turn a Railroad Spike into a knife. Class cost will be \$110 with lunch from Sonny's BBQ included. Class size is limited to 12 people. There will also be one open forge for those not interested in the class. Proceeds from the class will go to support FABA.

The April 23rd meeting (9 a.m.-3 p.m.) will probably be held in Navarre. We say probably, because we are still working out the details for the location. But if the stars align correctly, we will have Jordan Borstelmann visit the Far West and demonstrate how to make one of his trademark axes.

The May 28th meeting (9 a.m.-3 p.m.) will be at Timber Creek Distillery (dirt road northeast of Crestview: 6451 Lake Ella Rd, Crestview) with the task to make a sea creature for our contribution to the FABA Con 2022 auction. We don't yet know how our judges Cam and Arron might weigh in, but you can count on great pizza from their stone oven and libations from the distillery (and maybe some axe throwing too).

Over the summer, expect us to meet at the Baker Block Museum, date TBD. Other summer monthly meetings are still up in the air. However, the October 22nd meeting will be back at Traditions Workshop to prep the trailer for the trip to the state-wide blacksmith conference in Gainesville. The forges are already reserved on that day for finalizing the team contributions to the annual conference auction project "creatures."

gives your ears and heart a major jolt and then, you hear them blast down the road, as fast as possible. Most of us cringe and pray that no human or wildlife happens to get in the way. As far as the loud engine noise is concerned, there is an ordinance against it.

I feel very bad for the elderly, as they don't need this startling jolt to their heart or parents of babies and small children who are trying to sleep because a lot of this happens late at night. Endangering the lives of others is serious business. People feel this situation has gotten out of hand and are looking for resolutions. Some suggestions I have heard from citizens are as follows:

1. More presence from the authorities at night in the neighborhoods, on Main Street and Commons Drive.

2. Security cameras added to help authorities catch these reckless drivers.

3. Speed bumps added on main roads and neighborhoods.

4. Much steeper fines (500 and up) and repercussions when caught speeding or with engines and car horns excessively loud. One punishment could include a month of daily picking up trash off the beaches, after

they've paid their big fine, of course, and while wearing one of those lovely, brightly colored jumpsuits.

One of the best examples of moving camera suture occurs

near the beginning of Belfast, as 9-year-old Buddy (the astounding Jude Hill) walks down his street on Aug. 15, 1969, just as a violent outbreak of the Troubles nearly engulfs him. Belfast comes to us from the perspective of Buddy (Branagh's own historical avatar), as he struggles to understand how parental conflicts are deepened by societal ones. Caitriona Balfe is dynamic as

(Jamie Dornan) suggestion that they move the family to safer neighborhoods in another part of the Commonwealth. But the real delight is in watching Pop (Ciaran Hinds) and Granny (Judi Dench) impart both earthy wisdom and nostalgia to young Buddy.

6. Mass (Fran Kranz, \*\*\*\*)

The best film I saw at last January's Sundance Film Festival. Make sure you breathe before vou see it, because vou won't take a breath during the tense 110 minutes of its runtime. Gail (Martha Plimpton) and Jay (Jason Isaacs) meet in a room in a church basement with Linda (Ann Dowd) and Richard (Reed Birney) to wrestle with or emotionally hide from a tragedy that upended all of their lives. It's a masterclass in acting. Mass shows that sometimes the most holy rituals may be rooted in our ability to show forgiveness to those who share our common humanity.

#### Nightmare Alley 7. (Guillermo del Toro, \*\*\*\*)

Writer/director Guillermo del Toro (Pan's Labyrinth, The Shape of Water) knows monsters-and the monsters are us. He continues this auteur thematic unity with Nightmare Alley, a dark, creepy examina-

tion of Stanton Carlyle (a shinyeved Bradley Cooper), a young man with tortured dreams who joins a carnival and learns how to con. The astounding cast looks like an Oscar after-party: Willem Dafoe, Toni Collette, Rooney Mara, David Strathairn, Mary Steenburgen, Richard Jenkins, but most especially Cate Blanchett, who burns up the screen as Dr. Lilith Ritter. Nightmare Alley is based on William Lindsay Graham's 1946 novel, which was previous made into a 1947 film noir of the same name. In theaters.

8. Tick, Tick...Boom! (Lin-Manuel Miranda, \*\*\*\*) A musical theater lover's dream: a musical by Jonathan Larson (composer of Rent), rewritten to tell a specific piece of Larson's life, as he's trying to get his first musical mounted on Broadway. There's a huge ensemble of important Broadway performers, writers, and producers who show up in cameos. But most of all, there's the love (and the hardship) of creating art. On Netflix.

#### 9. The Green Knight (David Lowery, \*\*\*\*)

Based on the 14th-Century poem Sir Gawain and the Green Knight, David Lowery (A Ghost Story) has constructed a brilliant modern-day fable about karma. On Christmas morning, the Green Knight challenges any in Arthur's court to a duel, saving that any knight who can deliver a blow to him will receive the same blow in

return next Christmas at the Green Chapel. Sir Gawain (Dev Patel) takes Excalibur and decapitates him, but then must go on an epic journey next year. He is given a green sash by his mother, which he will told will protect him as long as he wears it. But there are many trials that await him on this mythic journev to death. #### 10. CODA (Sian Heder, \*\*\*)

A breakout hit at Sundance, this film had audiences both laughing out loud and weeping uncontrollably. Ruby (Emilia Jones), a "Child of Deaf Adults" (Marlee Matlin/Troy Kotsur), helps with her family's fishing business in Gloucester, Mass., but joins her high school choir to be closer to a boy she likes named Miles (Ferdia Walsh-Peelo, the lead in Sing Street.) There are powerful moments where we are placed in the subjective space of the deaf characters and feel a little about what it would be like to be cut off from the social and communal cues of their small town.
