

### Heroes: The Horse Soldiers of ODA 595 (Part 1)

Sept. 11, 2001: the first enemy attack upon American soil since Pearl Harbor. World attention immediately focused on the innocent victims of the attack and the first responders who gave the ultimate sacrifice. Until recently, another heroic part of the story remained classified and hidden from public view. The release of a Warner Bros. movie called "12 Strong" gave the world a glimpse into the secret missions that took place in the aftermath of 9/11. The film depicts the true story of the retaliatory attack by the first Special Forces soldiers entering Afghanistan.

These soldiers were tasked with a broad mission: defeat the Taliban; eliminate the terrorist haven in Afghanistan. The Special Forces team chosen to lead the offensive was the Operational Detachment-Alpha 595 (ODA 595). The mission, expected to take several years, toppled the Taliban in just a matter of months. ODA 595 led an unconventional warfare



campaign by partnering with indigenous forces to topple the terrorist-supporting Afghan government. The Western media appropriately labeled ODA 595 "The Horse Soldiers."

The Greater FWB Chamber of Commerce, with President and CEO Ted Corcoran at the helm, celebrated history by making history. The Fort Walton Beach gathering was the first time the Horse Soldiers reunited. Remarkable as that is, the Chamber is the only organization in the world to host the final reunion of the Doolittle Raiders in 2013 and the first reunion of the ODA 595 Horse Soldiers.


Backstory: conflicts have raged in Afghanistan for more than 100 years. Ethnic factions have been continuously at war. The ODA 595 operation was aptly described as a 19th century Afghan military using horse cavalry with 20th century weapons systems. When ODA 595 arrived, it added 21st century technology and the might of the most powerful nation on earth to eradicate the threat. The mission brought devastating air power with the full force of the United States military's advanced weapon systems. The mission of ODA 595 was not accomplished with tanks or mechanized vehicles but on horseback with only one man experienced with horses. Horseback riding lessons started as the men traveled through the treacherous terrain.

ODA 595 was inserted about 100 miles from Mazar-i-Sharif, which linked up with ethnic Uzbek fighters under Gen. Abdul Rashid Dostum. They had to earn Dostum's trust and help

him capture Mazar-i-Sharif, opening a beachhead into the rest of the country.

Ted said the Chamber is no stranger to honoring our brave military heroes. Earlier this year, it held the Final Goblet Ceremony honoring the Doolittle Raiders. Just like the goblets for the Raiders, the Horse Soldiers will have silver canteen cups, the Army equivalent of goblets. The Chamber commissioned these mementos, which were unveiled at the banquet, with the support of the local business community.

"The United States of America has been attacked twice," said Ted. "Pearl Harbor, with the first group to retaliate being The Doolittle Raiders. Sept. 11, 2001, with ODA 595 being the first in Afghanistan to defend




We are in a unique time right now, perhaps "such a time."

#### Parks & Recreation Committee

This committee focuses on environmental issues that will improve the appearance, aesthetics and ecological quality of life for our community. The committee also identifies and recommends to the City Council projects relating to recreational matters, including the need for additional parks and recreational programs and facilities for the citizens and visitors of Destin. The committee shall also perform such duties and services as may be assigned to it by the City Council.

Meetings: Fourth Tuesday of each month at 4 p.m.

Harbor & Waterways Board

The purpose of the Harbor Board is to inventory all existing and potential sources of pollution; to monitor the overall condition of Destin Harbor; to review and recommend plans for future growth development of Destin Harbor, including the review of projects requested to be located on the harbor; and to review plans for development on the waterways of Destin, including Choctawhatchee Bay, bayous, and other estuaries. Meetings: Fourth Monday of each month at 5 p.m.

#### Harbor Community Redevelopment Agency Advisory Committee

The Harbor CRAAC was created to provide recommendations to the CRA Board of Directors on how best to implement the adopted Harbor CRA Plan.

#### Recently revamped in re-

sponsibility, the Local Planning Agency's major focus is to act in an advisory capacity to the City Council on matters relating to the Comprehensive Plan and Land Development Code amendments, re-zonings, and vacations of rights-of-way/easements. Members of the Local Planning Agency are required to file an annual Financial Disclosure form for which there is an automatic per day penalty imposed by the Ethics Commission for late filing.

Meetings: First and Fourth Thursday of each month at 5:30 p.m.

#### Public Works/Public Safety Committee

The Public Works/Public Safety Committee's role is to identify and review various functional areas relating to public works, including street construction and maintenance, public parking areas, sidewalks, city rights-of-way and the like; assess the need for projects relating to matters of public safety including, but not limited to traffic signals, street lights, crosswalks and the like and to make recommendations to the City Council.

Town Center Community Redevelopment Agency Advisory Committee

The Town Center CRAAC was created to provide recommendations to the CRA Board of Directors (City Council) on how best to implement and improve Main Street and surrounding areas inside the adopted Town Center CRA Plan.


Bobby won in the majority Republican Okaloosa County while running on an independent platform that put "projects over politics."

### Sorting Through the Noise of Medicare Annual Enrollment

For those folks new to the Medicare Annual Enrollment Period (AEP), the overwhelming volume of mailing pieces, emails and phone calls are dizzying. For those folks more experienced in this time, the sigh of despair and cries of "Oh no, not again!" can be heard from every balcony and rooftop.

Keep in mind, the closer we get to Dec. 7 (the official end of the AEP), the more intense it will get if you let it. Regardless of your experience level, there are some things you can do to quell the noise and help make the best possible decision for you.

First, make sure you pay attention to the mail and phone calls you receive from your existing insurance company. These communications will be very valuable to you as they likely will be about the changes to your current plan in the new year. Too often, because of the volume of clutter mail, folks tend to throw these out along with everything else just to try and keep the kitchen counter clear. As the saying goes, don't throw the baby out with the bath water!

Next, try to make a real effort to understand everything you can about your current plan. Know the exact name and type of plan as well as how much you are paying in premiums. Is it a Supplement Plan? If so, which one; M, N, G, F, etc.? Know which type of Part D or, Stand-Alone Prescription plan (if any) you have, to go along with this Supplement Plan. Know your deductibles, co-insurance and copays. Know if you are able to use your pharmacy of choice. Know how the coverage Gap (commonly known as the "Donut Hole") works in your plan.

Perhaps you have an Advantage Plan instead. Again, know the exact name and type of plan as well as how much you are paying in premiums. Being that most Advantage plans have the Prescription coverage built in, you will likely not have a separate premium for Part D. However, you will need to know the deductibles and co-insurances for the entire plan. Oftentimes, there will be a separate deductible for the Advantage Plan and the Prescription coverage within the plan. Also, know your copays and whatever Extra Coverages your plan offers such as Dental, Hearing, Vision, Rewards Programs, Silver Sneakers, etc.

The two last, most important pieces of information you will need to know about your current plan is, what your premium will be and are your doctors/medications going to be on the plan in 2023. Will you have in-network options in other States? Some plans get better, some plans not so much. Some get more expensive and some reduce to as low as \$0 per month. Some doctors stay and some doctors go. Some medications get more expensive, less expensive or simply are not covered. It all depends on where you live and the plan you have.

Now, finally, you are armed and ready to attack that onslaught of external information. Be careful of where you look! Many of those ads you see on TV with famous sports figures/



actors are nothing more than marketing companies looking to get your information to sell to anyone willing to pay for it. If you respond to those ads, you will only make the onslaught of mail, emails, texts and calls that much bigger.

Work with people you know and/or reputable insurance companies you know and recognize. Deal directly and don't be afraid to let someone know you would prefer they not contact you again if you have settled on what you want to do.

That is the final important point. Now that you are well informed and have made a well-informed decision, you will feel much better about changing the channel when the next Medicare ad shows up on TV. You can sort your mail over the trash barrel. Talk about stressfree living!

### Make a Difference with Guardian ad Litem

One of the greatest gifts you can give to a child is the knowledge they have someone on their side. Carita Smith, Volunteer Recruiter, for the Florida Guardian ad Litem, is on a mission to ensure that local children who find themselves displaced from their homes know there is someone they can still count on to advocate for their best interests. In our area, there should be 136 volunteers. There are currently only 43.

The Guardian ad Litem is made up of a three-pronged system that becomes part of a child's team when a judge rules they need to be sheltered, or removed from the home. One part of Guardian ad Litem is the Case Advocacy Manager, who maintains the level of care from the office and supports the volunteers to ensure they can advocate effectively. These managers are on staff along with the child's Best Interest Attorney to make sure the team is running smoothly. At the center of the trio, is the Volunteer Child Advocate. It is this volunteer

who visits the children to make sure their needs are being met. If they find the children are in need they report back to the Case Advocacy Manager and the attorney to see if services can be put in place. They are the thread that connects the child to the judge and all other agencies that work with the court. Their sole mission is to take care of the child. It is this Volunteer Child Advocate position that Carita is working hard to fill and it is mission-critical.

"We work alongside any agency that's in contact with that child," Carita said." If the child is in foster care, we visit with them at least once a month, but our volunteers usually go more often. We talk to the child, make sure they're getting what they need, and ask how they feel. We want to make sure their innermost person is taken care of.

"We also talk with the foster parent to get a sense of how the child is behaving and what their day looks like," she continued. "If the child has interactions with their parents, we want to know how they responded to the



visitation so we can keep an eye out for any triggers. If they're visiting with a parent twice a week for 30 minutes to an hour, how's that child's behavior when they come back? There are a lot of variables that go into a visit like how the visits are maintained and observing how the child feels after these visits. What we observe then becomes information that we provide to the court."

Due to the shortage of volunteers, Case Managers often have to fill the additional role of the Child Advocate Volunteer, which is far from ideal. Carita shares the steps to becoming a CAV.

"There's a three-phase training process," she said. "The first phase is talking with me, submitting your application, and having your fingerprints taken at no cost to the volunteer. You must also pass a level two background screening because of the

confidentiality that is required and the places you're going to. You're part of the court system and officially taking care of the needs of a child on the state level. Have a clean background.

"Phase two is the classroom portion which is 30 hours, so you do get a lot of training before you get started. Volunteers can choose to do it all online or in two parts by doing the majority online and then coming to a one-day class from 9a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

"Phase three is the most important because it's when you go out and do the work," Carita said. "This is when you're visiting with a child, going to court, seeing how the parents react, and seeing how the judges behave. Just going into court can be scary but when you just observe and start building an understanding of what people are doing, then it becomes easier. You understand that you're just putting down on paper what you observed and passing it on to someone else. You understand your role in the process of helping these children."

So who would make the ideal volunteer?

"Someone who loves children," Carita said. "You have to want to see children get beyond traumatic situations. Children remember what's happened to them so you have to be patient. Be confident in your abilities so you can ask critical questions."

Carita stresses that once someone becomes a volunteer, they have plenty of support from the case manager and attorney on their team. In addition to their immediate team, there are also mentors who have been in the position for multiple years, and events are put together so volunteers can be together and make a connection.

As for community support, Carita asks that you contact her to speak about Guardian ad Litem to your churches, small groups, networking groups, businesses, classrooms, etc. She will talk to any group that can help grow the volunteer base.

### Is it Time to Park a New Sleigh Under Your Tree?

Why this holiday season may be an ideal time to buy that preowned vehicle you've been dreaming about

Whether you consider yourself a well versed auto aficionado, or someone who simply desires a dependable and presentable automobile to get around in, it's certainly no secret that both the new and preowned automobile market have been immensely inflated over the past two years. Some of this overvaluation has been due to issues related to the ongoing semiconductor chip shortage, while some - particularly in the used car segment - has been driven by a need for auto dealers with too little inventory to make similar profits while selling fewer cars. This isn't dissimilar to the perils of many other types of businesses in the past three years. However, this is changing, thankfully.

From 2020 to 2022 we quite literally saw used car prices skyrocket more than ever in automobile history, with the average consumer price of a new vehicle in our country increasing by 6.3 percent from the beginning of 2021 to the beginning of 2022 alone. This, in turn, caused the retail price that most consumers were paying for used vehicles to escalate by 7.2 percent during that same one-year period, according to the U.S. Department of Labor's latest consumer price index.

All of this means many of us - from dealers to end consumers - have been paying prices that were above previous book value over the past two years. Remember, in simple terms, if the dealer had to buy it high, the dealer had to sell it high – and the truth is, for a while, cars, trucks and SUVs were all trading for well over what their book values could substantiate. There's no reason to feel bad about being one of those people if you did this yourself. However, I hope you like your car a lot, because



unless you paid for it or decide to toss a wad of money with it in a future trade, you're likely to be stuck with it until it's paid off, something that will most likely haunt the automobile industry by negatively impacting new car sales a few years down the road.

Jump ahead to the third quarter of 2022, and a lot has changed in the auto industry, and much of that is to your favor, thus, making it a better time to buy than over the past two years. Think of this: only a short year ago people were buying an already depreciating asset, for up to 40 percent above its value, then lenders were actually financing those purchases, based on those inflated num-

bers. I personally think that's a recipe for disaster that we won't see the impact of for two to three years, when people attempting to trade in those vehicles find that they still owe 25 percent to 50 percent more than any dealer or private party would be willing to pay for it. But that's a discussion for an entirely different article, and one not quite as upbeat and positive as gifting yourself or your loved one with a new car this holiday season.

In the short term, those in-

flated sales prices of the past two years, combined with supply and demand issues, began to push the actual book values up, too - not to the amount the cars were being sold for, but some. This was because many valuation analysis tools such as NADA and KBB (National Auto Dealers Association, and Kelley Blue Book) are at least partially built upon the averages of current sales transactions, as reported by consumer reporting agencies and automobile dealers around the country. However, it is now a fact that prices have been coming down at the major auctions for close to six months as of this writing, and though it takes a while for the dealer pricing to catch up to the auction and wholesale trends (in terms of what they paid for their current inventory) we are now seeing the results of substantial-

ly lower prices (which also affect real book values that are also trending downward from what they were for the same vehicles six months or a year ago) at the retail level.

Over the last four months of 2022, we've seen wholesale pricing of almost all pre-owned cars drop considerably around the country. This means that consumers should see those 10-15 percent reductions passed on, with retail pricing already showing signs of tremendously trending downward in major metropolitan markets where more people want more cars, along



with more dealerships needing to sell cars, often keeps the prices most competitive. This is exactly why this holiday season may be a much better time to negotiate that 'best price deal' than any time in the past two years would have been.

As of this October used vehicle prices were down 10.3 percent from a year ago, according to The Manheim Used Vehicle Index. The wholesale price of used luxury brands is getting hit the hardest and is down 13.5 percent from this same time last year. This is exactly why buying a three- to five-year old Audi, BMW or Mercedes - even at a good price - is often less expensive than even buying a preowned Toyota, Honda or Genesis of the same year, class size and mileage. Preowned SUV prices are down 12.3 percent for the same period, and pickup trucks have now dropped in price by almost 9 percent over the past 12 months.

All of this represents what I see as a definite bright light at the end of the proverbial car buying tunnel, if you're in the market to buy this holiday season or going into the new year. Having the knowledge of these industry pricing trends can positively affect your ability to close your best deal possible on your next automobile purchase. Remember, car buying isn't like buying clothing, furniture or the food you eat. Almost everything is somewhat negotiable in the world of used automobiles. Whether you're buying a F250 King Ranch, a 911 GT3, or a 4Runner, do your homework. Know the real value of the vehicle you're considering buying. Check the prices for the same vehicle in other markets. And if you have a vehicle to trade, know what the NADA and KBB average dealer trade in is, and ask for that price for your trade. 

Whenever I think of this cake, it reminds me of exciting holiday vacations with my Nana and Papa John in Rome, Ga. Nana always prepared this cake, a tradition at Thanksgiving and Christmas and it is, seem-

ingly, very different from any cake I've ever had.

One of the fondest memories surrounding this cake is my cousin, Leta (a year younger than me), and I sneaking down the stairs and into the kitchen during the night to snatch another piece! We gave Nana fits over this (and other things, too!). After many, many years, I decided to make it this Thanksgiving. 1 cup Boiling Water 1/2 teaspoon Salt 2 Eggs





Once each year, Destin boat owners make the holidays sparkle and brightly glow by adorning their vessels, any size, with as many lights and decorations as possible; then cruising in with true Destin spirit, all in a gleaming row, through the historic Destin Harbor. To me, this is one Destin tradition that gets me into the holiday spirit!

Now in its 36th year, participating boats light up the night on the Harbor where the brightest, most creative ones win and a few lucky captains gain bragging rights to the most decked out boat in the area with their blinking lights, animated characters and other holiday fare for this December Destin delight. Sponsored by the Destin Fishing and History Museum, thousands of excited fans gather to watch boats of all shapes and sizes from the Harbor's docks, businesses and boardwalk-glittering, bright powerboats, party boats, pontoon boats, sail boats and yachts-parade by as costumed revelers join in the mix. Boat crews dress in theme costumes and entertain using all things that assault the senses from a visual and sound standpoint.

Museum Executive Director Kathy Marler Blue says there can be as many as 30 boats competing in the eight boat categories. Cited by Coastal Liv-

ing as one of the Best Holiday Boat Parades in America, the first boat parade was started in 1986 by the first museum which was the "Destin Fishing Museum" and was located in the old "Jitney Jungle" building (now where the McGuire's complex and businesses are) as a way to give back to the community for all the support shown to the museum. That first museum was started in 1985 and operated until 1996 when the property was sold. Many of the charter boat wives that helped start that first museum started the boat parade and it continued through time. In 2003, the community came together again and started a new museum, The Destin History & Fishing Museum, which was opened to the public Oct. 1, 2005, and the group continued the boat parade. Proceeds benefit the Destin History and Fishing Museum.

This year's Holiday on the Harbor Boat Parade begins at 6 p.m., Sun., Dec. 11 at Boshamp's. Boats will start lining up in the Harbor from 5 - 5:30 p.m. then make their way from the east side of the Destin Harbor to the west side (Harborwalk Village/Emerald Grande) ending near the Destin Bridge and East Pass area. View the boat parade anywhere from Boshamps Seafood and Oyster House along the Boardwalk to Harborwalk Village



### CarePatrol Helps Find the Right Assisted Living Facility – Free

Transitioning to an assisted living facility can be traumatic, an onerous chore that no one really wants to undertake. It can be expensive, time-consuming and, sometimes, dangerous.

But where to turn for advice, help and protection?

"We help steer our clients to resources to help pay for assisted living," said Cynthia Gilley, 57, a Senior Care Consultant with CarePatrol, an organization with some 150 outlets around the country, serving more than 20,000 communities. It was founded in 1993 by a social worker who observed the personal trauma experienced by a family whose loved one had been placed in the wrong type of facility. "I've been in the field caring for people pretty much most of my career," she said. She has spent 35 years in caring for people, mainly older adults and those with cognitive difficulties, last two of which were spent working for CarePatrol.

Gilley's compassion is homegrown. Her father suffered with Alzheimer's Disease for 13 years before dying, and caring for him was an ordeal for all concerned.

CarePatrol not only finds financing for those destined for assisted living, it helps find facilities, as well as home health care, for its clients. And the service is completely free for the client. "We have contacts within the community which pay for the service," the Fort Walton Beach native said. "We've contracted with probably 95 percent of the communities. They see this as a benefit to them."

Gilley said she "tours clients around like a Realtor. We

evaluate a facility's violations, which can include lack of maintenance, state regulation violations, insufficient staff, medical errors, abuse and neglect."

Among the criteria Gilley examines in order to serve her clients are location ("They want to be close to family"), finances and the needs of the client. Not all facilities can handle certain medical issues, she said. And, if a client wishes to remain in his home, she finds resources to provide whatever help he needs to retain a reasonable quality of life.

"The hardest thing is trying to find affordable memory care," she said. "There's a huge lack in that area."

Gilley has a passion for her work and her company. "I can't think of anything I don't like," she said. "My boss is great, my co-workers are wonderful. They share a common passion with me. There's a cohesiveness."

The most interesting aspect of her job, Gilley said, is "being able to place Alzheimer's clients. Alzheimer's is my passion because of my father having it. I know how hard it is on the families."



### **Bring Back the Praise!**

You don't have to teach a dog to be a dog. You must instead allow a dog to be a dog; a dog that lives in a human world, so to speak, when we take it on as our companion. As a dog owner, you should be accepting of the fact that you must meet its innate needs. This is achieved through satisfying your dog's drives for certain things like hunting, retrieving, chasing and playing, among others. It is imperative to have good communication, set boundaries, and show fair leadership. Dogs like leadership, believe it or not. As a pack animal, it is instilled deep in their psyche to follow the leader - not



Communication is a multi-faceted and oftentimes highly challenging piece of the puzzle. My experience spans decades in the dog world, and I have very rarely seen a forced relationship work with a dog. If a dog does not want to do something, it won't do it until convinced there is some benefit in doing it. The touchy part of that is finding the thing the dog will see as a benefit, then not overdoing the benefit so the dog only elicits a behavior for a motivator. The motivator typically will be a treat or toy and we are neither going to have those things constantly available nor should we need to. When we



fall into this trap, it moves the relationship to one based solely on bribery. While this might work for the short term and has value for conditioning, the bribery mechanism can lose value with many dogs and create frustration for humans. The force mechanism typically loses value in its absence, often testing a dog's resolve to avoid doing the wrong thing so it can satisfy its own desires.

Instead of force or bribery, we must teach dogs that our praise is enough, that their actions have value to us, that they make us happy. In turn, they are happy with our happiness and resounding praise of them. I challenge people to remember the first time they laid eyes on their new dog or cute little puppy. Muster up the courage to praise it with the same enthusiasm you did back then, before it started doing bad things, before its drives really began to show themselves to you and before its impulse to act on those drives became uncontrollable. Praise your dog for lying still and doing absolutely nothing. Praise your dog for making eye contact with you. Praise your dog for the little things and they will seek your praise for good behavior. Set boundaries and be fair!




If your home is older than 15 years, you most likely don't have enough insulation to meet today's guidelines. Prior insulation code for this area was R-19 (roughly 6.5 inches of insulation); now the new code is R-30 (roughly 10.5 inches of insulation). That's a 61 percent increase. Why the increase? This is the time of year to have your house or business inspected for water damage, and tested for mold and mold projects before the busy season starts again.

If there are any issues or when issues arise, high-temperature drying methods could be the way to go, saving you thousands of dollars, costly repairs and time out of your home.

Much more cost effective, with high temperature drying methods, it only takes a few days to get in and out of the house, condo unit, etc. usually without tearing anything out. Hardwood floors can also be dried, which saves thousands and thousands of dollars, and is normally done in about a week.

In the water damage restoration industry, anything over 90° ambient conditions is considered high-temperature drying. High temperature dehumidifiers mean that they work in temperatures up to 120°, compared to standard refrigerant dehumidification, which becomes very inefficient above 85°.

Why is high temperature drying important? Every 18 to 20° that we can increase the temperature of the materials that we are drying, we are able to double the rate of evaporation. In other words, we can dry twice as fast with high temperature drying. This also comes with years of experience, trained employees and investing in the right equipment.

The added benefit of hightemp drying is the fact we can dry deeper into materials. Let me explain: hot moves to cold, which increases the vapor pressure in materials as the temperature increases. It is a must to use dehumidifiers that work in higher temperatures, when doubling the materials vapor pressure. We suggest it is a good idea to review your assets, stocks, bonds, cash, real estate, business interests and family interests, among others.

### Second: Know Where you Own It

It is a good idea to conduct an inventory of all your assets and where they are held.

Third: Know How You Own It

Also, do all your assets have a beneficiary?

Many people want their families to avoid the probate process if possible. Having a beneficiary on as many assets as possible is a common practice. Some might find that using a living or revocable trust is an effective way to ensure that assets pass directly and avoid probate. Single people, be they widows or widowers, might want to review how their home is titled and to give some thought to how that asset will pass upon their death. Next, we suggest you think about what your estate plan is. Whether you have a formal plan or not, you do have an estate plan. Formalizing it might make sense:

Chief among these is to have a will. It usually makes sense to at the very least have a will. It is often a good idea to also have a power of attorney in place (we suggest a durable power of attorney, which takes effect if you are physically or mentally incapacitated. Note, those cease at passing). Also, an advanced medical directive for family, friends and loved ones to carry out your wishes if necessary. That would include things such as a do not resuscitate order for vour caretakers

Next, what is your long-term care plan?

Whether formalized or not, everyone has a long-term care plan. Will it be workable for you and your family is the question. Long-term care can come in the form of insurance (be it a term policy for pay as you go, or the increasingly popular asset based long term care insurance). Many people want to be able to rely upon family so it is a good idea to perhaps formalize that and to learn what support and benefits might be available to them (for example, some states are allowing family members to apply for payment, through Medicaid, for providing in-home care for a family member). Most people will need some form of longterm care and the need grows for most people in their last two or three years of life.

Also consider if you have a permanent source of income at retirement

It is a good practice to go to ssa.gov and get updated on what your Social Security benefits are scheduled to be. Also, do you have a pension (most estimates are that fewer than 15 percent of private sector workers have these anymore)? Perhaps you have deferred annuities that can pay you and or a beneficiary income for a lifetime.

Do you have a protected or conservative source of cash on which to draw for emergencies and opportunities?

Is that cash in the bank, a money market mutual fund, or CDs? For some it might be cash value life insurance which we feel is best left as a strategic



reserve particularly if you are taking an income stream from your investments. That way you can shield yourself from the effects of the sequence of returns (which means you are taking more of your principal in down years and might run out of that source sooner than expected). We feel most retirees, or those needing a consistent source of income should not ever tap into principal.

It is considered a good practice to review and perhaps update all things as they pertain to your wealth and your health periodically or at the very least to go through this exercise on a yearly basis. # The Road to Redemption: Children in Crisis and The Children's Neighborhood

When she heard the authoritative knock on her front door, she quickly ran to her baby brother and grabbed his hand. Her eyes were great pools of fear and, with a trembling voice, she begged to not be separated from her little brother. Their home, such as it was, was home no longer, and she didn't know what would happen next.

The vision for Children in Crisis, a non-profit 501(c)(3), began in 2002 in a living room of concerned citizens who worked in school systems and foster They were concerned care. about how many times children, removed from their abusive and unsafe homes, were shuffled from one foster home to another because of the severe shortage of foster parents. More often than not, siblings were separated, further traumatizing the children. This core group wanted a better way to meet the needs of these vulnerable children, with a vision of opening a foster care neighborhood.

Children in Crisis and their Children's Neighborhood is now a reality, sitting on 20 acres of beautiful land in Fort Walton Beach, through a charity land lease by Northwest Florida State College. They serve Circuit 1, comprising the counties of Walton, Okaloosa, Escambia, and Santa Rosa. On this land, Children in Crisis has an emergency shelter for children removed from abusive environments on short notice, where they can stay temporarily. Then there are five family-style foster homes where foster parents live on site, and eight studio apartments for young adults who have aged out of foster care but aren't ready to be on their own yet.

Children in Crisis' mission is to keep brothers and sisters together. They've worked diligently to obtain the funding to build the neighborhood and have placed foster parents in each home to watch over and care for children, keeping brothers and sisters together, greatly mitigating the need to move them from one home to another; thereby giving them a better chance to heal and grow strong. Every adult who works at

Every adult who works at The Children's Neighborhood



lets the children know they are in a safe environment. Many of the kids that are removed from homes arrive with only a Walmart bag of a few items. Many don't even know how to use a shower. And because many have lived not knowing when they would eat again, hide food in their rooms. These are just some of the behaviors these abused children need help with overcoming.

Children in Crisis has seen lives transformed and children

able to trust adults again and flourish at school because of the unique setting at The Children's Neighborhood.

Their greatest need right now are foster parents. They have two empty homes waiting to accept and house children, but no foster parents to receive them. Fostering is a calling, and though it's not an easy job, God equips those who are prepared to do the work.

The Bible doesn't directly instruct us to be foster par-


